Please remember as you pray...

- Today is Pentecost Sunday; as we celebrate Pentecost, let us pray that our Church continues to be a light to the community and the world.
- Argentina's monthly inflation rate is expected to dip into single digits for the first time in six months, offering some relief amidst the country's broader economic turmoil. While the government's austerity measures have helped curb soaring prices, they have also stalled economic activity, hurting workers and the poor. As Argentinians navigate these challenging times, we pray that the Argentine government prioritizes the well-being of all its citizens, especially the lower-income groups, in its efforts to stabilize the economy.
- An energy summit in Paris aims to raise billions to expand access to clean cooking methods globally, particularly in Africa, where over 2 billion people rely on polluting fuels that cause 3.7 million premature deaths annually. The International Energy Agency and the African Development Bank are spearheading the effort to address this pressing issue that intersects with gender, health, climate, and development. May this international effort be blessed with the resources and resolve to bring clean cooking and sustainable energy access to all.
- The COVID-19 pandemic has had a profound impact on the mental health of • teenagers, with a study showing that their brains aged about three years during the 10-month lockdown. The isolation and disruption to social interaction led to increased anxiety, depression, and even premature brain ageing. Let us pray for our youth's mental health, and may we be alert to the possible impact caused by lockdown and lack of social interactions during the pandemic. May our youth find the strength and support to overcome these challenges and emerge stronger.
- In Hong Kong, the tragic loss of a mother and intellectually disabled son early this • week highlights the urgent need for greater support for caregivers. Despite government efforts, more must be done to provide respite services, residential care, and community assistance to ease the immense pressure on families, especially during health crises. Let us come together as a compassionate neighborhood, looking out for those in distress and offering a helping hand, so that no one has to

face such unimaginable challenges alone. May this heartbreaking incident inspire us to build a society of mutual care and understanding where no one is left behind.
