Please remember as you pray...

- Hundreds of thousands of people have flocked to Rome to pay their final respects to the late Pope Benedict XVI, who passed away last week aged 95. The late Pontiff will be laid to rest on Thursday, with the reigning pope, Francis presiding at the funeral. May his soul rest in eternal peace, and the faithful be comforted at this time of loss.
- Evacuation orders and advisories are in place in northern California as a major storm is expected to slam into the coast. Regions that wildfires have hit in the past were among the first places to be told to evacuate due to concerns about flooding and landslides. May God protect those in the path of the storm and strengthen those whose jobs are in prevention and recovery for affected areas and people.
- Families in Sri Lanka have to choose which child will attend school, a decision needed due to the economic hardships all are facing. Though education in the country is free, there is no provision for uniforms, transportation, books and food for the children, so education has become a luxury many can no longer afford. It is hoped that the government will seek alternative ways to provide these necessities needed by the children to continue with a good solid education.
- The World Health Organisation has warned that China is under-representing the true impact of Covid in the country particularly the number of deaths. This mistrust of information sharing has had a rippling effect on other countries worldwide as more restrictions are introduced in dealing with those travelling from China. In addition, the WHO has issued very distinct guidelines in record keeping for Covid which China has decided to ignore and develop their own system. As a result, it is difficult to know the full impact of the virus on people.
- The Ukrainian forces launched a New Year's Day attack on Makiivka, targeting a building used as a dormitory for Russian conscripts. The building was razed to the ground, and the attack brought about many fatalities though the exact number is unknown. We continue to pray for peace in that part of the world and an end to all the bloodshed.
- Here in Hong Kong, the number of daily Covid cases remains high, with over 16,000 reported mid-week. We pray for all who have lost loved ones to the virus, and we remember our frontline staff in hospitals and care and attention centres as they continue to provide for those in need.

• Let us pray for our primary school children as they prepare to return to a whole-day face-to-face school. Many have already started, and others will begin after the Lunar New Year break. May the Lord's hand of protection be on them.

• We lift up in prayer the churches and people of all faiths in Iran, Iraq and Syria.
