Please remember as you pray...

- Ukraine's defence minister has said Russia is preparing a major new offensive in the days leading up to the first anniversary of the initial invasion last year. It is known that Russia has amassed thousands of troops awaiting deployment. Such a move would be catastrophic for both sides; may this not be so! Let us continue to pray for peace in that land.
- Last week, half a million workers went on strike in Britain, calling for higher wages in the largest walkout over a decade, closing schools and severely disrupting transport. As the cost of living increases in the country, no increment has been made in most workers' wages, and families are struggling to survive. We pray for a solution and that people's work will be appreciated and recognised.
- Pope Francis continues his tour of the Democratic Republic of Congo, sharing with the masses words of Hope and Promise.
- We pray in support of those pro-democracy activists in Myanmar who are now
 engaging in a 'Silent Strike' to mark two years since a military coup removed
 Aung San Suu Kyi from power. People are urged to stay home, and businesses
 are asked not to open their doors. Meanwhile, the state of emergency has been
 extended for six months. May the Lord sustain the people in this peaceful action
 of solidarity.
- United States Forces are seeking to strike up a deal with the people of the Philippines to open up access to several military bases in the country. The bases in question would offer the US forces vantage points covering China and Taiwan. The US forces would not occupy these sites but would have access when

and if needed. We pray for all discussions on this matter that those who have been deeply affected by the history between the two countries may find the support and comfort they need.

- Authorities in Western Australia are well relieved after a tiny radioactive
 capsule, which a mining company used as a density gauge, was found after being
 reported lost. The loss triggered a massive search along an 870-mile route across
 the state. Though the object is only 8 mm long, it could cause considerable
 damage if tampered with. We thank God this was not the case; the capsule was
 located and appropriately secured.
- In an attempt to save the iconic Star Ferry, the Executive Council has approved an increase in the fares by more than 50 per cent. As a result, senior citizens will no longer enjoy free ferry rides but must pay the subsidised concessionary rate of HK\$2. We hope this new rate will enable those who use the service to continue to do so and also to save the company from closing.
- We continue our prayers of thanks as we see the number of new Covid cases drop. Praying always that the Lord will strengthen those who are sick and those who care for them.
