God does nothing except in response to believing prayer. – John Wesley

Please remember as you pray...

- 24 February 2022 was the day Russian forces attacked Ukraine. One year on, and it seems very little has changed. Military and civilian fatalities continue to grow, as do the numbers of displaced people. We pray for peace, healing and true reconciliation.
- U.S. President Joe Biden's administration has released a plan that will make it harder for migrants from South America to claim asylum once Covid border controls lift in May. It would require adult asylum seekers to use an app to book a meeting with US officials or first claim asylum in another country before reaching the US. Failure to comply would make migrants ineligible if they make it to the border. We pray that hearts will be touched by the plight of those reaching out for a new beginning and life and that such plans will be more compassionate.
- The Brazilian State of San Paulo is suffering the effects of heavy rains, which have triggered landslides and severe flooding, destroying the livelihoods of many. It is thought that at least 36 people have lost their lives. May God comfort those who mourn and strengthen all to recover from this natural disaster.
- On Wednesday, the United Nations Development Programme proposed reducing the debt of 52 low and middle-income countries, two days before G20 finance ministers meet in India. This is good news indeed, and we pray it be so.
- At least five people have died, and fifty others are missing after a coal mine collapsed in Alxa League, Inner Mongolia region. Rescue teams have responded and are searching for survivors from the collapse. Pray for those who have lost their loved ones and those waiting for news. Pray also for the success of the rescue teams.
- A South Korean court delivered a landmark ruling on Tuesday recognising the rights of a same-sex couple for the first time, with activists hailing the verdict as a major victory for LGBTQ rights in the country. The case in question will now go to the Supreme Court. Justice for all!

- Months later, after thousands protested against the zero-Covid policy on the streets of China, protestors are being rounded up and held in police custody. Many of the arrests have been made quietly. May God protect these people who were brave enough to stand against the system and keep them and their families safe.
- In Hong Kong, Financial Secretary Paul Chan began delivering his 2023 budget in the Legislative Council on Wednesday morning, the first under Chief Executive John Lee's administration. May this be a fair budget with consideration for all in our society.
- The court cases of the 47 pro-democrats continue, with the courts opening up additional rooms for viewing through live streaming. Let us continue to pray for a fair and just trial for all.
- We continue our prayers of thanks as we see the number of new Covid cases drop. May the Lord continually strengthen those sick and those who care for them.
