## **CONCERNS OF THE CHURCH**

God does nothing except in response to believing prayer. - John Wesley

#### Please remember as you pray...

- Several regions of the world are currently dealing with rain and flooding on a catastrophic scale—California, Malawi, Turkey, and Nepal, to name just a few. The infrastructure of several of these places is non-existent after other devastating natural disasters and the effects of global warming. As a result, hundreds have lost their lives and livelihoods. Crops have been ruined and destroyed. Lord, help us help them in ways that will make a difference in their lives, comfort those who mourn and strengthen those left behind.
- For almost two decades, the guns of war have sounded in the eastern Democratic Republic of the Congo, and the conflict has worsened in recent months. More than 100 armed groups are fighting government and regional troops. It is estimated that 5.6 million people have been forced to flee their homes. The number of fatalities is thought to be over 6 million. We pray for an end to the brutal war and a peaceful solution found to end this conflict once and for all.
- Progress and developments in many world areas do not fully consider the land's indigenous people. Many are cheated out of their homes and lands and forced to leave their sacred spaces. Cultures and traditions are lost under the might of the bulldozer and influenced by greed and power. May the voice of those 'lost' be heard and found and balance introduced.
- As the shadow of COVID lessens in our city the number of community testing centres stands at five, and all others will be closed down. After deep cleaning and disinfection, the suspended centres will revert to their original community and recreational purposes as soon as possible. In addition, the airport centre will remain operational. We thank God for this moving forward in Hong Kong; let us continue to strive to be mindful of all who are around us.
- All five franchised bus companies in Hong Kong plan to increase fare tariffs. However, unlike rail firms, there is no objective fare adjustment mechanism for buses guided by inflation or the wage index for Hong Kong. This said, each company presents a different proposal. Therefore, a system needs to be developed and accepted by all that will also consider the needs of the people using the services.
