For the World, China, and Hong Kong

- As of 20 March, the coronavirus (COVID-19) has now infected more than 230,000 people and killed more than 10,000 globally, with over 83,000 recovered cases. Countries around the world are closing borders and putting citizens under lockdown in a bid to contain the rapid spread of the new coronavirus outbreak, labelled a "pandemic" by the World Health Organization. We pray that the world leaders will make the right decisions in protecting lives. We pray that medical professionals, cleaners and workers who are more at risk in their jobs to contract the virus are given adequate protective gear and equipment. May God protect and bless them. May God lay his healing hand on those who are infected, and welcome those who succumbed to the virus into heavenly peace. Pray for love and peace in this global health crisis. When people are keeping social distancing for the sake of public health, we are reminded to connect each other with love in our heart and live a meaningful life.
- China has declared a decision to expel at least 13 journalists from New York Times, Washington Post and the Wall Street Journal from China as retaliation against the "unreasonable oppression" of Chinese journalists in the United States. This new measure is applied to Hong Kong and Macau as well. It is a big blow to the freedom of press, and brings further damage to One Country, Two Systems. May the SAR government and journalists defend people's rights of free press and free speech as much as possible.
- We pray that the #MeToo movement does not stop along with the 23 years prison sentencing of the former film producer Harvey Weinstein who raped and sexually assaulted more than 100 women. May we not forget the women around the world who are still suffering from abuses in various forms. May God hear their cries for justice and give them courage to voice out for help.

- It has been a year since the Christchurch, New Zealand mosque mass shootings causing 100 deaths and injuries. The many paths to recovery are still long and winding for survivors. We pray for these families, and we pray that people with different religions may reconcile in all faiths.
- Hong Kong's rising unemployment affects the catering, retail, hotel, and construction sectors hardest during the outbreak. May we remember those who struggle with finances. Let us be filled with God's love and extend our hands to one another in times of need. Pray for those who are in quarantine and isolated, as well as those who live in fear and anxiety.

For the Ecumenical Prayer Cycle

• We lift up in prayer today the churches and people of all faiths of Czech Republic, Poland and Slovakia. We **give thanks** for the faithful witness of Christians here through the centuries, especially in times of occupation and persecution, as well as the religious freedom and ecumenical cooperation that is growing.
