Please remember as you pray. . .

- This Palm Sunday, several churches in Hong Kong have been refused permission by the police to conduct their Palm Sunday Processionals around the neighbourhood of the church. Pray that churches may find alternative ways to celebrate and commemorate the Lord's entry into Jerusalem.
- Outrage is growing in Mexico following a fire at a migrant detention centre claiming the lives of 38 migrants, with 28 others receiving treatment in hospital. It is alleged that security officers in charge of the centre failed to unlock the only escape exit, thus trapping those detained. We pray for the recovery of those injured and comfort for the families of those who have died in this incident.
- Countries in the European Union have approved a landmark law that will ensure all new cars sold from 2035 must have zero carbon emissions. Though late to start this move, we pray that this can make a difference.
- As the world moves forward in its attempt to use and promote clean energy use, let us remember the grassroots workers involved in the industries. For example, Cobalt – an essential commodity in producing electric cars – is mined in the Democratic Republic of Congo. Yet, as the mine owners grow more prosperous, there has been no improvement in the income or safety of the miners. A fair wage for work is called for all workers throughout the world, may it be so.
- A new report warns the world that rapidly melting Antarctic ice is causing a dramatic slowdown in deep ocean currents and could have a disastrous effect on the climate. The currents carry vital heat, oxygen, carbon and nutrients around the globe. The downward movement of cold, dense saltwater towards the seabed near Antarctica partly drives the ocean currents. However, seawater becomes less dense as the icecap melts and the downward movement slows. We have been warned for many years, and now the warnings are proven, let us not be so complacent but be active in doing what we can.

- Recently, our newspapers have been telling us of the great need for skilled and unskilled workers here in Hong Kong. As a result, several industries are suggesting bringing overseas workers to fill the tasks. Pressure is also on the government to consider training programmes for those in Hong Kong. Let us pray that those here in Hong Kong will be noticed and offered a means to be eligible for this work.

For the Ecumenical Prayer Cycle

- We lift up in prayer the churches and people of all faiths in the Balkans – Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia, Kosovo, Montenegro, North Macedonia, Serbia and Slovenia.

- the rich legacies that this area has long embodied
- those who kept both the people and their faith alive during years of repression
- those pursuing peace and reconciliation between the different ethnic and religious groups
- the resurgence of the ecumenical witness of churches in recent years.

We pray for:

- a continual healing of historic memories and pains that have been mutually inflicted
- those who continue to experience marginalization and injustice, especially the Roma
- religion to be a means of healing rather than of further separation and exploitation
- the nurturing and sustaining of pluralistic societies in the Balkans.
