God does nothing except in response to believing prayer. – John Wesley

- Over the last year, the streets of Iran have been filled with the cries of women and men seeking freedom of choice to wear or not wear the hijab. However, the voice of another group is now being heard from within these protests. Members of the LGBTQ community are protesting, carrying placards adorned with the Pride flag, using the platform to let others know they are not alone in their gender struggles. Unfortunately, many of these young activists are quickly arrested by the authorities. Let us remember these brave people seeking acceptance in a country where they are forced into hiding their true selves. May the Lord protect them.
- In war-torn Yemen, at least 85 people lost their lives, and many were injured in a crowd crush as they waited to receive charity distributions for Ramadan. Officials blame the incident on the lack of organisation of the exercise. At a time when our Muslim brothers and sisters will be celebrating the breaking of the fast, many families in Sanaa will be mourning. May God comfort and sustain them at this time.
- Eleven Indonesian fishermen have been rescued after surviving six days without food or water on a tiny island off Australia's coast. Another vessel and crew were also hit during Tropical Cyclone Isla last week. Unfortunately, nine of the ten crew members are still missing and presumed dead. Pray God's comfort fall on the families of these men who have died. And let us never forget to thank and recognise those who risk their lives so that others may have what they desire.
- Lawmakers on Wednesday passed amendments to occupational health and safety laws, increasing the maximum penalty for serious breaches by employers. Many welcome these changes, but concerns are shared for small to medium enterprises and their ability to meet the cost of the fines. Nevertheless, this added protection for those in the workforce is genuinely welcome and will bring a sense of hope.
- Waiting time in Hong Kong's public hospital Accident & Emergency department has been scrutinised after one patient was found dead in a waiting room toilet, following a 12-hour wait in A & E before her condition was assessed. A coroner's inquest will be conducted, and authorities have said they will look into improvement measures to avoid another such incident. Pray that a solution can be found for this and that waiting times can be cut down and people receive the treatment needed.

- the Georgian Orthodox Church, that it may rediscover a rich relationship with the family of churches worldwide.
