CONCERNS OF THE CHURCH

God does nothing except in response to believing prayer. – John Wesley

- In the first few days since the controversial border policy known as Title 42 expired, the United States Border Patrol has sent approximately 2,400 people back to Mexico, including Cubans, Nicaraguans and Venezuelans. As people seek that chance at the borders, we continue to pray that all voices will be heard before any repatriation is carried out.
- The number of executions recorded globally in 2022 was the highest in five years, as several Middle Eastern states ramped up their use of the death penalty, as reported by Amnesty International. It has been recorded that 883 people are known to have been put to death; this figure does not include China as data is classified. The taking of a life should never be the answer to situations. Pray that the Lord softens the hearts and minds of those in governance to end such practices.
- Until now, how many lives have been lost in the recent Cyclone Mocha, which hit Myanmar's Rakhine State and parts of Chin State, is uncertain. However, a United Nations spokesperson has reported that nearly 3.2 million people were likely to have humanitarian needs due to the storm. In addition, about 95% of the shelters in the Rohingya camp of Thet Kae Pyin have been obliterated. May God strengthen those struggling to find loved ones and pray that the help needed can be given to all people.
- Falling birth rates are a significant concern for some of Asia's biggest economies. As a result, governments in the region are spending hundreds of billions of dollars trying to reverse the trend they introduced. We pray that we can learn from this experience of trying to 'be god'. Then, with encouragement and the absence of pressure from authorities, more couples will be blessed with children.
- A Chinese fishing vessel carrying 39 crew members capsized in the Indian Ocean.
 International Search and Rescue teams have been deployed to the area the ship capsized, with units from Australia, China, Sri Lanka and the Maldives. The remains of two crew members have been retrieved from the ocean. As the search continues, may the families of those waiting for news of their loved ones be comforted with the peace and love of God.
- Our Primary Four students in Hong Kong came second in the Progress in International Reading Literacy Study in 2021 in dozens of countries and territories. It was recorded that 70% of places suffered a decline in scores amid the pandemic. We congratulate these young people for their achievements and remember those who have not fared so well during that time.

• For the Ecumenical Prayer Cycle

We lift up in prayer the churches and people of all faiths in the Indian Ocean Islands: Comoros, Madagascar, Maldives, Mauritius and Seychelles.

We are thankful for:

- the spectacular scenery, exotic plants, rare animals and abundant sea life that flourish in the region
- how people who are ethnically and religiously diverse have long lived together
- the economic developments that have lifted some out of poverty
- the vital evangelism, social and public witness of churches, and how the churches relate to people of other faiths.

We pray for:

- the fragile environment and the unique plants, animals and lands that they will be protected, especially as the sea rises
- tourism and other economic developments that they will not threaten, but enhance life for all the people in these countries
- churches, that they will grow through evangelistic efforts and in their work with those of other faiths
- Christians to be bolder in their public witness for justice and reconciliation, especially in times of political turmoil.
