CONCERNS OF THE CHURCH

Acts 2:1-4

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly there came from heaven a noise like a violent rushing wind, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. And there appeared to them tongues as of fire distributing themselves, and they rested on each one of them.

For the World and Asia

- It is recorded that as of 28 May, over 5.7 million people had contracted the coronavirus COVID-19 globally with over 356,000 deaths and over 2.35 million recovered cases. In Hong Kong, there have been no cases identified from the local community since 15 days ago. Transit flights will also return to city's international airport from 1 June. May we all continue to take cautious measures to prevent contractions as a way to show our responsibility to our loved ones and our society.
- A church in Germany's capital, Berlin, has helped a nearby mosque comply with physical distancing guidelines by hosting Friday prayers for the Muslim brothers. We thank God for the practice of this church hailed as "an amazing sign of solidarity" which has brought ecumenism one step closer.
- In United States, a 46-year-old African-American named George Floyd, was killed by a Minneapolis police officer. This incident has raised local protests and global concern about the police's abuse use of power over a

marginalized community. We pray that Mr Floyd may rest in peace, his family be comforted, and racial equality and justice be upheld.

- The National Security Bill that was proposed and passed by the National People's Congress, bypassing the existing legal system in the city, has seriously damaged "One Country, Two Systems" and the rule of law in HK. May God comfort the grieving hearts, give hope to the people to stand for justice, and strengthen the church to speak the truth against evil with courage. May the international community demonstrate solidarity with Hong Kong, fighting for freedom, democracy and human rights.
- Pray for those who had been arrested last week when they were out on the street to exercise their freedom of expression. Most of them are students. May God protect them and bless them.
- June 4th marks the 31st anniversary of the student-led democratic movement in China in 1989. The government's restriction on gathering has made the annual candle-lit vigil in Victoria Park difficult this year. Let us continue to remember the victims and pray for their families. May the quest for a free and democratic China persist in the midst of difficult times. Keep praying for good governance in China: rule by law, clean and accountable government to serve their people instead of manipulation of power. We yearn that the civil rights enjoyed by the people in HK will not be eroded.

For the Ecumenical Prayer Cycle

In the Ecumenical Prayer Cycle we remember in our prayers today the churches and people of all faiths of Lesotho, Namibia, South Africa, Swaziland.

- We give thanks to the faithful witness of churches throughout the world during apartheid and how people of different races and lifestyles have come together since then.
- We pray for these countries that the protection of resources can be launched for the good of all rather than their exploitation for economic gain. We also uplift the people in these regions that measures can be taken to effectively counter rape, sexual violence, and other crimes.

For the Congregation

- We pray for members and friends who are not feeling well. We remember Connie's grandma, Victoria's son Isaac and his classmate Mr Huang in facing health challenges.
- Keep remembering our seniors friends and praying for students who will go back to school in the next two weeks.
- Pray for the church renovation carried by AMO.
