CONCERNS OF THE CHURCH

God does nothing except in response to believing prayer. - John Wesley

- As wildfires continue to rage in Canada, people in North America have been advised to wear N95 masks outdoors due to poor air quality caused by smoke. Much of the smoke is coming from Quebec, where they declare this the worst fire season on record. Thousands of residents are expected to be forced to evacuate in the province. A similar warning has been issued in New York City warning New Yorkers to don facemasks when travelling in the city. We pray for those fighting the fires for their safety and success in their task, seeking a sense of peace for those facing the possibility of evacuating homes and property and protection for the wildlife in those most affected areas.
- An earthquake with a magnitude of 4.9 has hit the Haitian city of Jérémie, causing at least three deaths, just days after torrential rains displaced 13,000 people and claimed at least 42 lives.
 Haitian Authorities had in operation recovery plans dealing with the flooding when the quake hit. The World Food Programme is providing Emergency Humanitarian aid to those displaced.
 May God strengthen the people who seek to claw back what they can from the double disaster.
- After years of imprisonment, Iran has released two Austrian nationals and a Danish national.
 The release of the three men is part of a deal between Iran and European Union members. May
 the Lord bless their homecoming and reunions with family and friends, and may the
 governments of these men provide for their needs medically and psychologically.
- Police in Ghana have been fined for failing to release information over alleged brutality in compliance with a directive issued by the Right to Information Commission. The Police force has often come under severe criticism over brutality and rights abuse against individuals and groups. Though the fine to be paid is not so high, we thank God that some sign of justice is being carried out against those charged.
- A dam in Russian-controlled Nova Kakhovka was breached in the early hours of Tuesday. The waters of the dam have led to mass evacuations. Up to 30 towns and villages along the river have been flooded, and fears that landmines dislodged by the floods may further cause destruction and fatalities are increasingly tangible. The dam provides water and irrigation for vast swathes of prime arable land. Both sides in the ongoing conflict blame each other for the breach. May the Lord protect those facing the flood waters, and may the damage to the dam be contained as the waters recede, allowing for repair.
- The Australian government has announced a national ban on Nazi symbols in an effort to crack down on Far Right groups. All public displays of swastikas or emblems of the SS will be punishable by up to a year in prison. We pray this action may indeed quell the growth of far-right groups using such symbols to aggravate and cause pain to those seeing them.

- HK Authorities have shared that those eligible for healthcare vouchers can merge their balance with their spouse if they are married. This will give greater credit to the couple for healthcare. This is a good move, especially for those whose partner has greater health needs; pray for its success.
- Last week in Hong Kong, several people were detained by police as they sought to commemorate the June 4 crackdown. Others were detained and questioned for wearing black in the streets. Though we could not gather and commemorate this important day in the history of democracy, many worldwide did. Let us remember those worldwide who willingly have given their lives for the democratic cause and those who continue to carry the torch.
- As temperatures rise in our city, let us remember in our prayers those who endure this heat day and night, those have no provisions to keep cool and those who may have the appliances but can not afford to use them.

- fair election of democratic governments to counter instability, violence and human rights abuses
- stable economies that enable all people to prosper and live in justice and peace

- the herders and farmers who continue to raise cattle and food, despite droughts and desertification.


Pastor Phyllis
