Please remember as you pray...

- Covid numbers in Hong Kong once again seem to have stabilized. There is much confusion surrounding the new vaccination rules. May God help us to understand better and let us give our continual thanks to God and look towards the day when all this will be in the past.
- The war in Ukraine continues to claim more lives as Russian forces push to control the city of Severodonetsk. Victory in this area will secure the Donbas region. In the city of Mariupol, the casualties discovered from the battle are increasing as more bodies are uncovered. Pray for peace throughout the world.
- The first flight of the controversial plan for the deportation of refugees to the African nation of Rwanda, suggested by the British government, is scheduled for 14 June. Several refugees on that flight are currently on hunger strike in protest of this move by the British government. May more people be involved in stopping this scheme from happening so that all those seeking asylum in the UK will be treated in the same way.
- The continued economic crash in Lebanon is taking its toll on everyone. Power outages, massive depreciation of the nation's currency, and shortages of fuel and medicines. One group sadly overlooked are those incarcerated in the nation's prisons. They are overcrowded, and inmates have no access to primary medical care unless they can pay for it privately. May their needs and voices be met and heard.
- A rescue ship owned by an NGO carrying nearly 100 people has issued an ultimatum to the Government of Italy that it would dock without authorisation to bring those they had rescued to safety. The numbers of those who are aboard the ship include 30 unaccompanied minors. May God protect those on board and keep them safe.

- Protesters in Tunisia seek to denounce the defamation of sacked female judges by President Kais Saied. Those dismissed have since faced online attacks and additional accusations raised against them. We pray for their protection and reinstatement.
- This week a popular snack food franchise store has closed up shop. Aji Ichiban has been present on our streets since 1993. The company still had 30 branches throughout the city, offering employment to 100 workers. The pandemic and the drop in the tourist trade are cited as the cause of the closure.
- Six people have been arrested in Hong Kong as authorities sought to restrict public commemoration of the Tiananmen Square massacre last week. All six are being held in custody.
- Hong Kong's outgoing Chief Executive Carrie Lam shared in her last question-and-answer session in Legco that though these years in governance have been some of the most challenging Hong Kong has seen, she is satisfied that she overcame the difficulties. She leaves the post with no regrets. We pray that the Lord will guide Hong Kong and those in governance so that the voices of the people will be heard.
- A Hong Kong start-up has joined forces with Sino Group, the developer, to upcycle plastic waste into sustainable construction materials. EcoBricks are made from recycled plastics, and the product quality is in line with or exceeds international standards. As cities like ours struggle to dispose of so much waste, we pray this project will continue to grow.
