God does nothing except in response to believing prayer. – John Wesley

- After 40 days alone in the Amazon Jungle of Colombia, four missing children aged 13, 9, 5 and 1 have been found alive after surviving a plane crash and the loss of their mother. Knowledge passed down from their elders enabled the children to survive the ordeal. We pray this amazing account of survival will inspire those involved in search and rescue and bring hope to those whose loved ones are 'lost'.
- It is unknown how many people have died after a fishing boat capsized off the coast of southern Greece; numbers may be in the 100s. Some have estimated that the vessel was carrying up to 400 migrants. Before it capsized, contact made by the coastguard to help was refused. Photographs captured by the EU Border agency showed that no one on the vessel was wearing life jackets. May the Lord comfort the families of those who have perished in this tragedy and strengthen those left behind and those seeking the lost. We pray that Authorities realise there must be a better way to deal with the migration issue, especially when fear of repatriation stops people from accepting help when help is needed most.
- South Africa's lower house of Parliament has passed a contentious universal healthcare bill described by the health minister as a "historic" moment for the country. The National Health Insurance (NHI) bill seeks to give South Africans "of all races, rich or poor and legal long-term residents" access to quality healthcare. This bill is in accordance with the constitution, adopted after Nelson Mandela was democratically elected in 1994. It has taken nearly three decades, but now it is happening. May this be a sign of encouragement for other nations striving for similar health care for all people.
- More than 100,000 people in India and Pakistan have been evacuated from the path of a fierce cyclone a day before its expected landfall. The cyclone is named Birparjoy, which means "disaster" in Bengali. The cyclone is expected first to hit the state of Gujarat. Pray for God's protection for the people of that land; may their actions work for their good.
- News shared in secret by North Korean citizens exposes the living disaster all there are facing due to the borders being closed more than three years ago. People are dying from starvation, many taking their own lives as the cost of living soars beyond all reach. Basic medical provisions are lacking as no new supplies can cross the borders into North Korea. We must pray for the needs of the people to be met and that those in governance will see that this is not how to govern the land.

- Thousands of people living near a Philippine volcano have taken shelter in evacuation centres. Officials warned on Sunday of health risks from ash and toxic gases spewing from the rumbling crater. Mt Mayon is located in the central province of Albay, about 330 KM southeast of Manila. Many risks are involved for those living close to a volcanic eruption, not only the land and its crop yields but the health of individuals and animals on the land. May the Lord have mercy on them.
- As PRIDE month continues in Hong Kong, we pray that the events being organised in our city will be not only times of celebration and get-togethers. May it also a time for people to be more informed about the LGBT plus community, enabling those not of that community to build a better understanding of those from the LGBT plus community.
- The government announced that Hong Kong is set to bring in as many as 20,000 non-local construction and transport workers to ease a workforce crunch in the sectors Tuesday. Priority is to be given to those positions needed to be filled in the public sector projects. An official said some workers could live at the Yuen Long Tam Mei Community Isolation Facility. We pray that all workers brought to Hong Kong will be treated fairly and justly with equal rights and wages.
- The Urban Renewal Authority has announced it would spruce up Mong Kok by introducing a
 nano park revitalisation pilot project, which could feature smart public fitness equipment. The
 project should be completed in four years. Hopefully, other city districts can be added to the
 project lists to enhance the living environments.
