



CONCERNS OF THE CHURCH

God does nothing except in response to believing prayer. - John Wesley

- As Pride month ends worldwide, LGBT groups in China cannot celebrate large-scale events for another year. Small low-key events happened throughout the country. Organisers are fearful of possible arrests if public events were promoted. Many LGBT support groups in the country have had to close their offices. We remember those in this community in China and pray they can source the support they need without fear.
- Under Benjamin Netanyahu's leadership, the Israeli government has advanced plans for some 5,700 new homes in the occupied West Bank. This brings the number of advanced homes in the territory to 13,000 in the last six months on land that does not belong to the Israeli people. As the world strives to create peace between the Israeli and Palestinian peoples, this action destroys any chance of this happening. Pray for justice in the Holy Land.
- Though yet another ceasefire was called for the people of Sudan to celebrate Eid, there were none of the usual celebrations seen on the streets of Khartoum state as gunfire and artillery shells continued to fill the air with noise. The streets, which would typically be buzzing with activity, stand empty as many are afraid to join in the public events of the Holy Day, including the call to public prayer. Let us pray for peace in that land and all other areas where the familiar sound of the day is the shot of a gun or artillery fire.

- An Indian court's recent verdict that significantly expands homemakers' rights over their husband's property is a positive sign for women in the country. The Madras high court in the southern state of Tamil Nadu passed a verdict in a domestic dispute case that allowed a housewife equal share in her husband's property. Though this is hailed as the first in the country, the verdict is only binding in the state of Tamil Nadu. It would also require the country's Supreme Court to accept and promote the move for the whole country to benefit from this ruling. May it be so that women in the country are given equal rights in marriage, property, and possessions.
- Australia's cyber watchdog has served a legal notice to Twitter demanding an explanation after one-third of all complaints received by the watchdog concerned online posts promoting hate and racial slurs. Social Media platforms are incredibly influential in today's society. Many are for the good, others the not so good. May this action by the Australian cyber watchdog team push other platforms and country leaders to be more mindful of the monitoring systems in place.
- This week, HK Chief Executive John Lee announced that the 59-strong government rescue team sent to Turkey/Syria after the devastating Earthquake in February will be the first recipients of the Chief Executive's Award for Exemplary Performance. The team faced many challenges during the time of the disaster, working in very volatile situations. We thank God that some individuals have taken up the call to serve the people of Hong Kong and the world in this unique way.

- those who work to bring justice for the victims of genocide and war crimes, including the International Criminal Court
- the many who carry out humanitarian work in these countries and who settle those who are displaced
- the economic progress and peacebuilding that has occurred in Uganda and for effective measures to curb the spread of HIV and AIDS.

We pray for:

- a cessation of ethnic animosities and violence and increased understanding between ethnic and religious groups
- an end to the rape and practices of genital mutilation of girls and women
- governments to respect the will and best interests of their people and the human rights of all
- natural resources to be preserved and the land saved from further desertification.
