Concerns of the Church

God does nothing except in response to believing prayer. – John Wesley

- Many countries, people and lands suffer under adverse weather conditions, intense hot weather in one area and endless rain and flooding in others. These and many other issues are signs of our failure to monitor our use of resources in the world. May God forgive us and protect those facing the hardships these conditions bring.
- Russian forces launched missile attacks on Ukraine's Black Sea coast, destroying 60,000 tonnes of grain and storage infrastructure after ending a deal which guaranteed safe passage for exports by sea. This action will affect millions worldwide, particularly in the developing world. Let us pray for peace in the World.
- The Supreme Court in Ghana has dismissed an application to stop parliament from considering a controversial anti-LGBT bill. The Human Sexual Rights and Family Values Bill 2021 would see LGBT people jailed for a maximum of three years and promoters of it imprisoned for up to 10 years. Let us pray that the hearts of those in governance will be open and receptive to reason and understanding.
- Ten months after the death of Mahsa Amini and the mass protests in Iran, the morality police have resumed patrolling the streets to enforce the dress code for women. The actions of the demonstrations have empowered many women and given them the courage to express themselves freely. May the women continue to be strong as they face these challenges and the consequences nationally of their choices.
- Hong Kong Police raided the family home of exiled pro-democracy activist Nathan Law. As a result of the raid, Mr Law's parents and a brother were taken into custody for questioning and subsequently released. Authorities issued a HK\$1 million bounty for Mr Law's arrest and seven other activists involved in the 2019 movement. We pray for protection for these young people whose commitment to democracy has driven some into exile, separated from family and all that is familiar. We pray the Lord will instil calm where there is fear.
- Let us earnestly pray for those in Hong Kong seeking employment as government • figures show a further drop in the rate. The unemployment rate is now 2.9 percent -

the lowest in almost four years. Numbers will likely drop again as those who recently graduated from school or university will be added.

• We join our hearts and prayers with the family and the many who knew and loved Methodist pastor Revd Yuen Tin-yau, who was 'called home' to be with God last week after a long illness. Revd Yuen was a man of conviction and integrity. We thank God for his life which bore witness to his commitment to strive for a just and democratic society in Hong Kong. We pray God's comfort and peace rest on those he loved and served, and may we always be inspired by the example he left.
