CONCERNS OF THE CHURCH

God does nothing except in response to believing prayer. – John Wesley

- During a five-day visit to Portugal, Pope Francis held private meetings with victims of clerical sexual abuse. It was recorded that nearly 5000 children had been abused, and the Church sought to conceal the issue, as has been the case in so many other countries. May the Lord bless those victims who are brave enough to speak out, and may they encourage all who have not spoken out and their loved ones.
- The situation remains tense after three days of violent clashes between Hindus and Muslims in the northern Indian state of Haryana. Six people were killed in the clashes, and many others were injured, leaving much damage to property and possessions. We pray for tolerance among the people and wise action by the government to stop the spread of hate, religious violence and misinformation which has caused so much suffering and loss.
- The latest reports have shown that the average waiting time for a public flat has remained the same; general applicants still are queuing up for 5.3 years on average. This is such a huge issue in our city. We hope the Government will work on this to give hope and make daily life easier for many.
- On Saturday, the Samaritan Befrienders released a report stating that the suicide rate in Hong Kong for 2022 was the highest in the past 15 years. About 60% of those who passed away were men, with half of the cases being elderly people aged 60 or above. In the days ahead, let us take time to reach out and acknowledge our neighbour. Our caring and even a smile or nod may make the difference for the one we meet.
