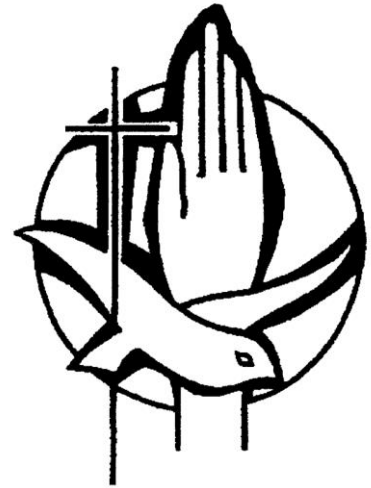

Concerns of the Church

God does nothing except in response to believing prayer. – John Wesley

- President Joe Biden has issued a "major disaster declaration" for the ongoing Hawaiian wildfires. Wildfires began on Tuesday and spread quickly, fuelled by winds from passing Hurricane Dora. Thousands have been evacuated, locals and tourists alike. The wildfires have devastated all in their path and claimed 53 lives, reported so far, though officials believe this figure will soon rise. As the flames grow smaller and are under control, we pray those involved in recovery, rescue and rebuilding are strengthened for the task. And may the Lord bring comfort to all who have lost loved ones.
- Former British Prime Minister Gordon Brown has publically announced his objections to the Taliban's treatment of women and girls in Afghanistan as a "crime against humanity" and is calling on the International Criminal Court to prosecute those responsible for the "vicious" abuse of human rights. It is hoped for the sake of womankind that these cries for recognition and equality are heard and acted upon.
- Forty-one migrants have died in a shipwreck off the Italian island of Lampedusa. The ship travelled from Sfax in Tunisia; the four survivors reached Lampedusa on Wednesday. More than 1,800 people taking this route from North Africa to Europe have lost their lives so far this year. The numbers are so high, showing again how people are forced to risk their all to find that place of safety. Pray for all facing forced migration that a way will be opened for them.
- Let us be glad to read that the United Nations has negotiated with Syria to reopen the sole crossing for UN aid deliveries to its rebel-held north-west after weeks of impasse. This route is a lifeline to 4.1 million people dependent on aid. May God continue to keep conversations going that will enable this to remain so.
- Six policemen in the Philippines are facing criminal investigation over the fatal shooting of a teenager whom they had mistaken for a murder suspect. Jorhode Baltazar drowned after being shot in the head last Friday. Too many lives have been needlessly lost in this way in the Philippines. May God comfort the young man's family, and as his story is shared, may justice be served.
- As we all feel the heat these past few weeks, let us think and pray for those working daily under the sun's heat. Those with no shelter or means to keep cool, especially remembering the most vulnerable in our society.

- In their attempts to 'make our city more fun', the Hong Kong Government has been advised to engage the private sector in designing and managing its public playgrounds, amid criticism that currently most facilities are dull and characterless. Our children need this scheme to encourage them to be more active and utilise the facilities.
- **For the Ecumenical Prayer Cycle**

We lift up in prayer the churches and people of all faiths in Burkina Faso, Chad, Mali, Mauritania and Niger.

- the heritage of ancient trade routes, rich oral traditions and nomadic practices of people in the lands these countries now occupy
- humanitarian work to improve food security and livelihoods, especially for women
- pro-active efforts to preserve the environment in these desert lands
- welcome and provision for those who often must flee across borders.

We **pray** for:

- those impoverished who lack basic needs and rights, that these will be met
- desperate children and others who turn to crime or begging or become enslaved
- effective response to the frequent droughts and hunger in this area
- more stable political rule in these countries to stem violence and to provide for all.
