For the World and Hong Kong

- Pray for Justice and Peace in Middle East: Israel and the United Arab Emirates (UAE) have reached a deal to normalise relations, with Israel agreeing to suspend its controversial plans to annex parts of the occupied West Bank. The agreement will deal with areas regarding investment, tourism, direct flights, security, telecommunications, technology, energy, healthcare, culture, the environment, the establishment of reciprocal embassies, and other areas of mutual benefit. US President Donald Trump, who helped broker the deal, accorded it as "historic" and a breakthrough toward peace. Palestinian leaders were, however, very negative about this agreement. The Palestinian ambassador to the UAE even regarded the deal as "treason". Pray for everlasting peace in the region that is grounded in justice and fair play for different parties to enjoy equal rights and respect of their identity and autonomy.
- Remember the people in Lebanon after the deadly explosion in Beirut and then subsequent massive anti-government violent protests that killed more than 170 and wounded more than 6000 people. Lebanon's government stepped down on Monday night. We pray for God's healing hands on the wounded and the country. May the poor who suffer most in a time of political and social unrest receive enough support and care. Pray for good governance and the leaders are given strength and wisdom to govern their nation with love and compassion. Pray for God's hope to dwell in Lebanon. With international support, may people's lives and homes be rebuilt soon.
- 20.6 million people throughout the world have contracted the coronavirus, the number of fatalities 749,000 people as of 14 August. In Hong Kong, the total number of confirmed cases is 4,313 with 65 deaths from the virus, mostly elderly people suffering from chronic illness. The confirmed cases last week still involved migrant domestic workers who were placed in a shared accommodation and those in elderly homes. We in particular remember and pray for these communities. We are sad to see domestic

workers who stayed on the street during their rest day were ticketed and fined by the police because they were accused of breaking the social distancing law. Many foreign domestic workers are not allowed to go out during their holiday by their employers due to the Covid-19 pandemic. We echo with NGOs working with the domestic workers that employers should respect their helpers and give them choice. Keep praying for the medical staff who are working in the forefront: for health and strength.

- Pray for people especially the vulnerable suffering from recent heavy rain in different parts of China. Pray that people's voice be heard and their needs be met under good and responsible governance.
- Pray for the freedom of press in Hong Kong. The founder of Apple Daily, Jimmy Lai, the young activist Agnes Chow Ting and others who have been active in the democratic movement have been arrested under the National Security Law last week. We remember people in the Philippines who have been suffering from human rights abuses under the Anti-terrorism Act.

For the Ecumenical Prayer Cycle

• We lift up in prayer today the churches and people of all faiths of Liberia and Sierra Leone. While we give thanks for how diseases such as Ebola have been brought under control, we pray for the majority of the people who are still impoverished, that adequate services and policies will be provided that enable them to live with dignity and good health. We pray too for a more just governance, free of corruption, accountable to the people, and that manages resources in ways that benefit all. May the churches in these countries continue to have interfaith cooperation with others and be faithful witnesses to bring forth peace.

For the Congregation

- Remember and pray for our elderly friends and our sisters employed as domestic workers amid increasing confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Hong Kong. May God bless and protect them. We uphold our children and their parents in our heart.
- Pray for members and friends who are in need of God's healing physically and spiritually due to health challenges and/or loss of beloved ones. We are grateful to God for Lucy's good progress in her treatment so far. Continue to uphold Pearl in our hearts.
