Concerns of the Church

God does nothing except in response to believing prayer. – John Wesley

- Yesterday was World Humanitarian Day. As we witness numerous natural and man-made disasters around the globe. We pray "for the survival, well-being and dignity of people affected by crises, and for the safety and security of aid workers."
- Rescue continues in the wake of the catastrophic Hawaiian wildfires. The death toll has risen to 111 as of Thursday and is expected to increase as only a small part of the disaster site has been searched. We pray for the victims of the fire, the well-being and dignity of the survivors and the safety of the aid workers amidst the disorder that ensues from this disaster.
- The situation in Niger following the coup d'etat remains tense, as the West African bloc ECOWA is reported to have activated a "standby force" and intervene militarily should "diplomatic efforts to reverse a coup fails". We pray for a peaceful resolution that upholds the well-being and dignity of the people in the country.
- Fierce fighting between two powerful militias erupted on Monday in Tripoli, the capital of Libya. Fifty-five people have been killed, with 146 injured. We pray for the senseless bloodshed victims and their loved ones.
- More than 60 people are feared dead as a boat carrying migrants was found in a shipwreck off the coast of Cape Verde in West Africa. Thirty-eight people survived, including four children between 12 and 16.
- Revd. Eric Attique Sidhu, one of our mission partners in Pakistan, recently shared with us that at least 22 churches have been burnt, and more than 60 houses have been set ablaze in his country. The attacks on churches have been an ongoing problem in the country. Similar attacks on Christians have also taken place in India as well. Let us remember churches and our sisters and brothers in Pakistan, India and other parts of the world where people of faith are experiencing violence and discrimination. Pray for safety and protection for Christians and people of other religions facing violent attacks. May the evil powers of destruction be stopped; may mercy, peace and justice reign in the land.

For the Ecumenical Prayer Cycle

We lift up in prayer the churches and people of all faiths in Liberia and Sierra Leone. We are **thankful** for:

- the natural resources in these countries that they might benefit the peace and welfare of all
- the diverse ethnic and religious groups who long have lived together in peace and harmony, especially the Muslims and Christians in Sierra Leone
- democratic election of leaders who have brought political stability and accountability
- how diseases such as Ebola have been brought under control.

We **pray** for:

- the churches in these countries, for their evangelism and social outreach, faithful witness and action in times of conflict, and for interfaith cooperation with others
- the majority of the people who are still impoverished, that adequate services and policies will be provided that enable them to live with dignity and good health
- more just governance, free of corruption, accountable to the people, and that manages resources in ways that benefit all.
