# **CONCERNS OF THE CHURCH**

God does nothing except in response to believing prayer. - John Wesley

- In a period of 24 hours, the Tunisian coast guard encountered nine boats of all shapes and seaworthiness carrying more than 180 migrants seeking a better life. The boats are occupied mainly by sub-Saharan Africans trying to reach Europe. The stretch of water that they were navigating has become the busiest migrant route into Europe. This is fast becoming a daily process; by God's grace, no one perished. May the protective hand of the Lord be on all, and those in governance in the countries of those leaving seek ways to consider the needs of all people.
- The United Nations and a host of humanitarian agencies are calling on the West African regional bloc, Ecowas, to grant exemptions to the sanctions imposed on Niger after the recent coup. Food and medical supplies are in great demand, and there are fears of escalation as electricity supplies are cut from Nigeria. May a way be found to open channels to supply this aid to the people.
- Fear is continuously rising within Palestinian communities as violence increases from extremist Israeli settlers, who continue to drive people off the land of their ancestors—inflicting damage to property, businesses and even the taking of lives, forcing Palestinians to leave and seek safety. And as they do, settlers move in to claim the land, expanding their already claimed area. We have seen how these two peoples chose not to live in harmony, people with more in common with each other than differences. May their eyes and their heart be opened to see each other.
- Australians will have a chance to vote in a referendum next month to decide whether to enact an Indigenous 'Voice to Parliament'. If approved, this will

recognise Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people in the country's constitution, allowing their voices to be heard and their opinions considered. It is only fitting that those who started on the land are recognised and given space. We pray for success in this referendum that all will be considered.

- Researchers in Hong Kong have found a worrying increase in the number of children in Hong Kong who are short-sighted. Much blame for this is placed on the past few years when children were not outside in the playground or attending school during the COVID-19 pandemic. Too much screen time is also a contributing factor. Let us encourage our children to interact more with each other and cut back on time with electronic devices.
- As our children return to school and some launch into school life for the first time, let us take some time to consider those with Special Education Needs within the classrooms. Our schools need to be more prepared to accommodate such children. Let us pray that provisions will be made for our schools' children needing special aid and for our teachers to be given the support they need.

## For the Ecumenical Prayer Cycle
