Concerns of the Church

God does nothing except in response to believing prayer. – John Wesley

- Natural disasters once again dominate our thoughts as in the space of a week, thousands of people have died in Morocco due to an earthquake and in Libya due to floods. These are only two of the many places in the world affected by natural disasters at this time. May the Lord receive those who have died, comfort the families as they grieve their loved ones, and strengthen those whose task is to seek and find the lost. We pray also that the governing bodies of these countries in great need will open their borders to allow aid agencies to respond to those needs.
- At least 177 environmental activists were killed worldwide last year, a report by the non-governmental organisation Global Witness suggests. Sixty of the killings occurred in Colombia, making it the deadliest country for environmental defenders. Let us pray for those who have given their lives protecting the environment. May their deaths not be forgotten and justice be served.
- Russian President Vladimir Putin and North Korea's Leader Kim Jong-un recently engaged in a meeting that has raised concerns worldwide. Though it is believed the purpose of the meeting was focused on the possibilities of Russia helping DPRK in developing its space programme, fears rise that other topics may dominate, including weapons and armoury. When faced with such scenarios, let us never cease to pray for peace in the world.
- At least 56 people are known to have died and dozens injured in a huge fire in Vietnam's capital, Hanoi. It is believed the apartment block, a new development in the city, was like many other new builds completed and occupied without meeting fire safety regulations. We pray for those who have died that their deaths will not be in vain but will spur the government of Vietnam to be more vigilant in assuring safety standards are in place before buildings are occupied.
- Local researchers at Kadoorie Farm appealed to local authorities to conserve farmlands in the future Northern Metropolis, stating that these sites are the

habitat of over a quarter of Hong Kong's bird species, ten of which are of conservation concern. These birds and other small animals unique to Hong Kong are a gift from the Creator, and we should try at all costs to protect and provide for them.

- The Government of the HKSAR has urged people to stop chasing a whale spotted in southern Hong Kong waters. The Agricultural, Fisheries and Conservation Department (AFCD) has initiated more patrols in that water area to shield the animal from those hoping to catch sight of the whale.
- We thank God for the dedicated frontline workers here in Hong Kong who have worked tirelessly to clean up our city after a super typhoon and black rains. Thank you!
