## **CONCERNS OF THE CHURCH**

*“The LORD is gracious and righteous; our God is full of compassion.”  
(Psalm 116:5)*

### **For the World and Hong Kong**

- The United Nations celebrates its 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary in the midst of a continuing climate crisis, the COVID-19 pandemic, growing threats to social justice, human rights and democracy, political tensions between countries, and worsening poverty. The strength of this institution lies in the strength of its members to uphold the rights and dignity of their people and the planet to which they belong to. We pray for our world leaders to embrace God’s call by serving as a way to lead and working together to resolve conflicts, make inequality history, and protect our world.
- In a recent campaign rally, US President Donald Trump addressed a predominantly white audience that they have “good genes”. Many organizations raised concern over the comment stating that it connotes “racial superiority” in a country already riddled with racially charged violence. May God’s love shine over places darkened by hatred, division and exclusion and that all our hearts beat with love, understanding and acceptance.
- The world was shocked by the Malaysian court’s decision to acquit the employer of Adelina Lisao, an Indonesian domestic worker who in 2018 was found dead outside her employer’s house with her head and face swollen and covered with wounds. We pray for justice for Adelina and that legislation in Malaysia as well as in other countries be made to strengthen protection for all migrants from exploitation and harm.
- The recent move of the Hong Kong Police to limit access for journalists to restricted areas and press briefings has been viewed as a step backward in upholding press freedom in the city. While upheld as legal by the authorities, many ask, “How far will we go in legalizing repression and censorship?” We seek God’s guidance during these trying times. May the city’s leaders and police uphold justice and people’s rights amidst a beleaguered democracy.

## **For the Ecumenical Prayer Cycle**

- We lift up in prayer today the churches and people of all faiths of Colombia, Ecuador, Venezuela. We are **thankful** for the beauty in these countries; and the good work of churches and ecumenical and other organizations to establish peace with justice throughout the region. We **pray** for the continued pursuit of peace in Colombia, the fulfilment of agreements reached, the reintegration of insurgents into society, broad and inclusive dialogue for justice, and fair compensation of those victimized by conflict; for the strengthening of democratically elected governments in the region, without pressure from outside interests; for greater respect for the human rights of all, especially vulnerable populations and those who work for the wellbeing of others and of the environment; and an end to the corruption in these societies, and to unsustainable exploitation of their resources.

## **For the Congregation**

- The Church Council and the Trustees have started the first session on strategic planning for the church. Please pray for the ministers, church leaders and the whole process. May God guide them with the vision from Christ that we may serve with unity and wisdom empowered by the Holy Spirit.
- We praise the Lord for healing grace and loving care to our congregational members and their family members who have been facing illness: Linda's sister Tess, Victoria's brother-in-law Drew and her sister Heather, Connie's grandmother, Bruce's mother and Phyllis's sister.
- We pray for our children and their parents for adjustment and challenges encountered in the new school term. May God bless them to learn with enthusiasm and curiosity, and grow in knowledge and maturity.
- Pray for members whose travelling plans either going back to Hong Kong or back to their home country have been greatly affected due to the pandemic. May God guide and open a way for them to cope.
