Please remember as you pray...

- Hurricane Ian has ripped through Florida, leaving utter chaos and causing millions of dollars of damage to private property, businesses and the environment. In addition, at least 108 people have lost their lives. As rescue and recovery attempts are underway, we pray the Lord will strengthen those undertaking this mammoth task and bring comfort to those who have lost loved ones.
- The World Health Organization has issued a medical product alert on four cough syrups produced in India, linking them with 66 child deaths in Gambia. We pray for the families of those who have lost a loved one. May the peace of the Lord rest on their hearts. And for the safety of all others who have purchased the medicine, as the contaminated medications may have been distributed further afield.
- As the war in Ukraine continues, Ukrainian forces reclaim regions and cities once controlled by Russian troops. Yet even as the Russian military offensive suffer such setbacks in its campaign, President Putin has signed the final papers to annex four regions of Ukraine. Let us all pray for peace to reign in all conflict areas worldwide.
- The recent death of Mahsa Amini has rekindled the passion of the women of Iran in their campaign for women's rights. Since 1979 women have been protesting against the enforced law to wear Hajib and the constant interference from the Morality Police. The government have tried to silence their voices but to no avail. Women and men across the generations are now engaged in protest. May God protect and bless them in their campaigns.
- Oxfam Hong Kong announced this week that the income gap in the SAR had widened during the pandemic and reached a 'critical point', urging the government to announce their plans for tackling poverty. As the gap widens, we pray that those with plenty would reach out to their struggling neighbours.

• Hong Kong's blood banks are dangerously low; many have been put off donating due to the pandemic with fears of infection and other factors in our society. So let us seriously consider giving blood if we can. It could be you or your loved ones needing this service to sustain your life.
