For the World and Hong Kong

- For human rights & democracy: 1) there have been massive pro-democracy protests in Thailand. On Thursday, the government had attempted to curtail the student-led protest movement by issuing an emergency decree banning gatherings of more than five people and arresting about 20 activists. 2) Protesters have been rallying across Nigeria to demand police reform and hold police accountable for their brutal acts. We pray that the voice of the people is heard and people's human rights on freedom of assembly and expression would be respected and upheld.
- Remember the activists who have been arrested and put in jail. May God's justice prevail and God's mercy be with the righteous.
- The number of cases of Covid-19 has increased rapidly in UK and France. A stricter control of measures to prevent the spread of coronavirus and to protect the people have been implemented. We remember people working in high-risk settings and those who have less resources to cope with the crisis. Pray for the scientists who have been working on developing the vaccines to prevent the spread of Covid-19 virus and save lives.
- We remember and pray for people who have lost their jobs and families that suffer from big drop of income that is adversely affecting their livelihood because of the Covid-19 pandemic. Pray that appropriate social policies and welfare systems are introduced and working well to address the needs of the poor and the vulnerable.
- Singapore and Hong Kong have agreed in principle to form a travel bubble exempting residents of both cities from any form of quarantine. May the government keep the public informed of its impact to the city in the midst of the global Covid-19 pandemic crisis. May human lives be taken as priority in enacting any social and economic policies.
- Carrie Lam, the Chief Executive, announced that the Policy Address will be postponed this year, which was quite an unusual move. May God bless Hong Kong and its people with hope and peace in the midst of uncertainty and suppression against the civil society that limit people's human rights.
