Concerns of the Church

God does nothing except in response to believing prayer. - John Wesley

- The situation remains tense in the Middle East. There had been reports that Hamas is demanding an exchange of Palestinian prisoners for the hostages they took during the 7 Oct. attack. Meanwhile the Israeli government threatens a ground invasion to Gaza to destroy the Hamas organization and its military infrastructures, with the hostages and the Palestinian people caught in the middle. In this toxic atmosphere of mutual hate and violence, where can we find hope for peace? We turn to God for mercy and pray for guidance, knowing that peace can only come when love eventually overcomes hate.
- Tuesday 17 October was the International Day for the Eradication of Poverty, which aims to promote understanding and dialogue between people living in poverty and the wider society. This year's theme draws on first-hand testimonials showing that those trapped in extreme poverty often work long, grueling hours in dangerous, unregulated conditions but still cannot earn enough income to adequately support themselves and their families. We pray for political leaders, policymakers, and business executives to use human dignity as the guiding compass in all decision-making processes, to ensure the advancement of fundamental human rights and social justice over the pursuit of corporate profits.
- India's Supreme Court has declined to legalise same-sex unions, dashing the hopes of millions of LGBTQ+ people seeking marriage equality. The court instead accepted the government's offer to set up a panel to consider granting more legal rights and benefits to same-sex couples. The chief justice suggested directions to the government, asking them to ensure the end of all discrimination against the "queer community" and to protect them from harassment and violence. Activists and same-sex couples said they were disappointed by the judgement and would continue their campaign.
- In HK, the Court of Appeal upheld a ruling that it is discriminatory and unconstitutional for the Housing Authority to bar tenants from registering their same-sex partner as family members of their public rental housing flats or subsidized flats, or becoming an eligible resident of those flats. The lawyer representing the gay couple who filed the review said: "Discrimination not only causes sexual minorities to suffer significant legal and economic injustice, but also often causes irreversible psychological trauma to them." We pray that

governments all over the world take proactive action to respect fundamental human rights, including the right to be free from discrimination based on sexual orientation.

- Police arrested two more suspects linked to the fast-growing case of alleged fraud and money-laundering involving more than HK\$1.5 billion in assets, bringing the total of arrests to 20. As the economy in China and Hong Kong stagnates, there is a steep rise in frauds and we pray that authorities take appropriate measure to protect our finances from this and no doubt other scams to come. At the same time, we need to stay vigilant ourselves and be wary of get rich quick schemes that shamelessly prey on our gullibility in this time of financial stress.
- An elite kindergarten in Kowloon Tong and a well-known secondary school in mid levels have announced their closure in 3 years' time. This seems to herald a wave of school closure caused partly by the dwindling birth rate, but also by the rise in emigration especially amongst the young to middle-aged professional class with families. This trend seems to be growing according to a recent survey of middle tier professionals which says that over 50% of their respondents have either started process for emigration or are actively planning. We pray for the leaders of Hong Kong to try to understand the real and pressing concerns of Hong Kong people including the economy, the rule of law, and the freedom of press, and find effective ways to address the concerns.
