Concerns of the Church

God does nothing except in response to believing prayer. - John Wesley

- The Israel-Hamas war continues with no end in sight. More and more horrific images surface graphically showing death and destruction caused by both sides of the conflict, and Gaza meanwhile has been turned into what a BBC journalist described as a wasteland. People around the world are being galvanized into more and more extreme opposition groups. We pray that people and their leaders around the world not to be blindsided by rage and the need for revenge, the further apart people become in their positions, the more we need to turn to our God for calm and inner peace, only then can there be hope for the love that is in all humanity to eventually overcome fear and hate.
- Musicians in Belarus have been given long jail terms as part of authoritarian leader Alexander Lukashenko's internal crackdown on dissent. Their sentences have been condemned as "an unprecedented prison sentence for creativity", and the situation seems to be getting worse. It has been reported that between January to June, there have already been 925 cases of human rights violations, including censorship and denying the right to a fair trial in the country. We pray for justice and protection of basic human rights, including the right for free artistic expression in Belarus and everywhere, knowing that while music can be silenced in some courts, but never in our hearts.
- This week is Inter Faith week, conceived in 2008 by the Inter Faith Network (UK), and is intended to build understanding between different faith groups to reinforce the values of understanding, compassion, multiculturalism and tolerance that form the building blocks of strong, flourishing communities. We are thankful for the diversity in our church and in our communities and pray that we continue to gain better understanding and celebrate how this enriches our lives.
- Chief Executive John Lee announced in his annual Policy Address last month that the government would offer HK\$20,000 to new parents. The move is an attempt to boost Hong Kong's low birth rate and address the city's ageing population. We pray that the Government would probe reasons that deterred couples from having more children

including gender inequality, long working hours, a lack of childcare options, substandard living spaces, as well as political events in recent years which prompted some to consider leaving HK and putting off plans to potentially have children.

For the Ecumenical Prayer Cycle

We lift up in prayer the churches and people of all faiths in Aotearoa New Zealand and Australia.

- the beauty of the land and waters of Aotearoa New Zealand and Australia, and the special relationship that people enjoy with the natural environment
- the identities and cultural practices that indigenous peoples long have maintained, and for their increasing political voice
- how the people have welcomed new immigrants
- how churches have witnessed and worked together ecumenically, especially amid challenges of apathy in highly secularized societies.

We pray for:

- churches to have the imagination, skills and energy to build bridges of understanding in increasingly multireligious and multicultural contexts
- those who work tirelessly on issues of justice for the poor, the marginalized and the dispossessed, especially indigenous peoples
- those seeking refuge and a new life in these countries, and those supporting and providing for them
- careful preservation of the fragile land, sea, and resources.

May we all remember the needs of the church as we celebrating the church's 100th anniversary, and let us be a good steward to make contributions and church leaders to use the budget wisely for God's sake.
