

CONCERNS OF THE CHURCH

For the World and Hong Kong

- World AIDS Day is celebrated every year on 1 December. The theme for the 2020 observance is "Ending the HIV/AIDS Epidemic: Resilience and Impact". World AIDS Day was first observed in 1988. May God give strength and wisdom to organizations and professionals working on this area of service and advocacy, especially during COVID 19 with additional challenges. There is a call to focus on vulnerable groups who are already at risk and expand coverage to children and adolescents. May the people who are infected by HIV be given equal access to medicine and social support. We pray also for a caring community in which people with HIV/AIDS may have lives of dignity, and free from discrimination.
- After weeks of fighting, the conflict in Ethiopia between the central government and the northern region of Tigray has escalated. We pray for reconciliation and the safety of civilians, as well as their ability to learn what's truly going on at a time when communications are cut and disinformation is rampant.
- We remember the people in India who are taking refuge from Cyclone Nivar, which has uprooted trees and toppled electricity poles across Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh and Puducherry. We pray not only for their protection but also inner peace. While natural disasters are out of human control, may we never forget that improved weather forecasting and better response plans are and will continue saving lives.
- With the sentencing of the leader of a chatroom sex abuse group in South Korea, we are reminded that sexual assault is still a serious issue for so many women around the world. We celebrate this justice that so many activists have been fighting for, and pray that it will be a step toward eradication of violence against women.

• As Hong Kong enters the fourth wave of Covid-19 cases, we pray again for healthcare workers who are battling the virus on the frontlines as well as those whose livelihoods are drastically impacted by social restrictions. The pandemic has altered so many lives this year. Let us open our hearts to God even more during these vulnerable times and listen to what God wants for us. We are thankful for the scientists who have developed vaccines in record time. May God guide an equitable and timely distribution in Hong Kong and other parts of the world.
