## **CONCERNS OF THE CHURCH**

God does nothing except in response to believing prayer. – John Wesley

#### Please remember as you pray...

- Mauna Loa, Hawaii the world's largest active volcano is erupting for the first time since 1984. As a result, molten lava is flowing down the side of the volcano, but experts have said this will not pose a significant threat to local inhabitants. Authorities have set up shelters if there is a drastic change in the situation. The power, beauty and wonder of this occurrence remind us once again of our creator, God. May the protection of God be with and on the people of The Big Island.
- For women in Afghanistan, the ruling Taliban have once again curbed the accepted activities of women in society. In Kabul, women can no longer take their children to the park; they are now barred from entering; this also applies to gyms and swimming pools. Male and female children can enter these places but will do so only with male family members. Fear is rising among the women in the country not sure what may happen next as it is expected these new rules will extend to the whole country. We pray for the women in the land that they can be strong to stand and demand to be treated as equals and not as commodities.
- Family members of those who died in the bridge tragedy in Gujarat's Morbi district still await justice to be served. Families have also stated that the local authorities have made no effort to comfort families by marking the area with a memorial showing the loss of many lives. Pray that love and peace may rest on the hearts of those who have lost loved ones. Pray that justice will be served on those responsible for this tragedy.
- A recent study released by Unicef and Save the Children estimates that one in five Filipino children is now at risk of sexual exploitation; this represents almost two million children in the country. The saddest part is that most abuse happens in the family setting. May God have mercy on these children and these families, that help may be found to keep the children in a place of safety and security.

- A Tokyo court has upheld a ban on same-sex marriages in Japan but also recognised that doing so violated human rights. Those who brought the case to the courts still see this as a positive outcome, even though they did not 'win' the case. These words shared indicate the need for change in the system.
- Areas of China have seen local people protesting against the country's strict Covid-19 restrictions. Unfortunately, some involved in the protests have been arrested for their involvement. Protests were heard in several cities as citizens remembered the lives lost in the recent tragedy in Urumqi, no one wishing to see this happen again. Although Covid case figures are soaring in the mainland, the government still maintains the zero Covid policy, which heighten the possibility of a repeat happening and heightens the people's fears. Lord, bring reason and peace to the people's hearts so that all may have their voices heard without violence and threats.
- The Hong Kong health authorities said this past week that plans are in place to cope with the upcoming winter 'twindemic' an expected surge in cases of influenza and the ongoing presence of Covid-19. Hospitals will be furbished with additional provisions. The number of daily Covid cases recorded remains high in Hong Kong at almost 9000. As the colder weather draws in and an awareness of our resistance being low, we remember especially the vulnerable in our society, the elderly, the young and those living with illness. May God strengthen those in our care facilities and those carers at home.
