Please remember as you pray...

- Pray for Migrants throughout the world, yesterday was International Migrants day. May the Lord protect those who find themselves on the perilous road seeking a new life and security for their families. Particularly we remember those who lost their lives on the journey.
- The weather throughout the world continues to control, dominate and destroy. Pray for the people of Kentucky and the surrounding states as they deal with the aftermath of a series of 6 tornados. Pray for our neighbours in the Philippines as thousands have fled their homes and livelihood in the wake of Typhoon Rai.
- That all will heed the warnings of the World Health Organization against the new Coronavirus variant Omicron. Records have shown that it is spreading at an unprecedented rate and was likely present in most countries of the world.
- Pray for Afghanistan where the young and the very old are dying of starvation and lack of basic medical supplies. International support which has sustained the people of the land is yet to be reinstated and the foreign reserves of the country have been frozen. In recent days an outbreak of Measles has claimed and maimed many children already weakened by hunger.
- For a just system that will recognize the need for better family mental health support in India as the government's National Crime Records Bureau recently released data that showed that 22,372 housewives took their own lives in 2020. An average of 61 lives per day or one life every 25 minutes.
- After a yearlong protest thousands of Farmers in India are returning home from Delhi after the government heard their pleas and responded in their favour.
- For those caught in the fire in the World Trade Centre, Causeway Bay, we thank God that the number of casualties was low. May the healing hand of God be with those admitted to hospital. Let this incident spur on owners of large public buildings to ensure warning systems are in good working order at all times.
- Pray for the safety of 22 people trapped in a flooded coal mine in Shanxi Province and for those involved in the rescue operations.
- As temperatures continue drop in our city pray for those who do not have adequate shelter or means to keep warm, those on the streets, those struggling to pay household bills, many looking for work.
