#### **CONCERNS OF THE CHURCH**

#### For the World and Hong Kong

- December 18 is International Migrants' Day. As we commemorate this day, we remember the more than seven million migrants in Asia Pacific who have been forced to return to their countries of origin. They face the insecurity of unemployment amidst a severely lacking health- and service-oriented response to the pandemic. Amidst the many challenges, we witness and have taken part in mutual help, solidarity and cooperation initiatives to help migrants and people in need. As we pray for our migrant siblings, Lord God, we ask for your guidance as churches and peoples work hand in hand to foster solidarity, advocacy and harmony during this time of pandemic and beyond. On behalf of the community, we give thanks to thousands and thousands of foreign domestic workers who have been working very hard for many families and making tremendous contribution to the people in Hong Kong. May they be fairly and well treated and recognized.
- Hundreds of thousands of farmers all over India continue to mount protests against three farm laws: The Farmers' Produce Trade and Commerce Act, 2020; The Farmers Agreement on Price Assurance and Farm Services Act, 2020; and The Essential Commodities Act, 2020. Already receiving widespread support and solidarity from the international community, farmers' unions and associations call for the repeal of the three laws, which are said to take away state subsidies for agricultural goods, deregulate prices of basic agricultural commodities, and allow corporate control of Indian agriculture. Advancement of profit-driven laws amidst the COVID-19 pandemic, they say, will push millions of people into utter poverty and hopelessness. We pray for the upholding of the interests of farmers and peoples in India. May their voices be listened to and their demands respected and acted upon.
- In Hong Kong, in the ongoing 4<sup>th</sup> wave of the COVID-19 pandemic, we remember our middle-aged brothers and sisters, parents and grandparents, as many of them infected with the Coronavirus are fighting for their lives.

As the virus strain becomes more virulent and many patients more critically ill, we pray for God's healing hands to restore their health and protect everyone from harm. We pray for God's guidance to provide relief, support and love to distressed members of our community.

• We lift up in prayer today the churches and people of all faiths in Japan, North Korea, South Korea, and Taiwan.
