

Please remember as you pray...

- Humanity faces an unsustainable waste crisis due to excessive production and consumption. Annually, households, small businesses, and public services generate 2.1 to 2.3 billion tons of municipal solid waste, including packaging, electronics, plastics, and food. 30 March is International Day of Zero Waste: may this annual event remind us of the critical importance of bolstering waste management globally. It celebrates zero-waste initiatives at all levels, contributing to the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. Achieving zero-waste societies requires collaboration from consumers, governments, communities, and industries. We pray that everyone be mindful of our waste habits and choose an environmentally-friendly lifestyle, cherishing our planet for generations to come.
- In Bolivia, heavy rains have prompted authorities to declare a state of emergency. Nearly 50 people have died in deluges across the country since the rainy season began in January, with landslides and overflowing rivers wreaking havoc. Let us pray for the victims, their families, and the tireless rescue efforts. May compassion and resilience prevail during this challenging time.
- Civilians are caught in Sudan's brutal civil war where there are harrowing accounts of rape, ethnic violence, and street executions. The struggle between Sudan's military and the Rapid Support Forces (RSF) paramilitary group has claimed over 14,000 lives, and reporters, facing enormous risks, have witnessed a devastating impact on innocent lives. UN officials warn that Sudan faces one of the worst humanitarian crises in recent history. The conflict threatens to trigger the world's largest hunger emergency. Let us uplift our prayers for the people of Sudan. May compassion envelop Sudan. Let healing replace hatred, and peace rise from the ashes. Our hearts ache for the victims, and we pray for their safety, resilience, and a brighter dawn.
- Chinese regulators have accused Evergrande, the insolvent property developer and its founder, of inflating revenues by a staggering US\$78 billion. The China Securities Regulatory Commission (CSRC) swiftly imposed a hefty penalty of 4.175 billion yuan (\$580 million) on Hengda Real Estate, Evergrande's main Chinese unit. Xu Jiayin, the group's founder and former China's richest man, faces a fine of 47 million yuan (\$6.5 million) and a lifetime ban from securities markets. The investigation, spanning eight months, revealed a web of violations, including

fabricated sales figures and failure to disclose crucial information. This alleged fraud, totalling 564.1 billion yuan (\$78 billion) over two years, marks mainland China's most significant financial scandal. Let us pray for transparency, justice, and stability in financial markets and for the regulators to act diligently to protect investors in Hong Kong.

• Hong Kong's legislature has swiftly passed a new national security legislation, locally known as Article 23, which gives new powers that critics fear will align the city's national security laws more closely with those on the Chinese mainland. The extensive 212-page bill introduces 39 additional national security crimes, including treason, espionage, and handling state secrets. The most severe offences could lead to life imprisonment. While China and Hong Kong's leaders argue that these laws are necessary to "plug loopholes" and restore stability after the 2019 protests, critics worry about their broad scope. Legal experts and business leaders warn that the law may further suppress civil society and impact information exchange, particularly in the financial sector. Let us pray for a balance between security and freedom in this complex landscape.
