CONCERNS OF THE CHURCH

- Thousands of US firefighters are battling a blaze in California that has grown so big it is generating its own weather system, with authorities warning conditions could worsen on Monday. Flames have grown so large that they have created clouds that can cause lightning and high winds, which in turn can serve to fuel the fire. The fires have so far been located in mainly rural areas destroying acres of woodlands and the wildlife. Rural villages located in the area have been evacuated. Firefighters are using many techniques to quell the hungry flames and we pray the Lord will protect and sustain them as they face this task before them.
- Against a backdrop of fires and floods, researchers are meeting virtually to finalise a key climate science study. The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) is preparing the most comprehensive assessment on the state of global heating since 2013. Over the next two weeks, the scientists will go through their findings line by line with representatives of 195 governments. Experts say the report will be a "wake-up call" to governments. It is hoped this work will be completed and will play an important role in guiding global leaders who will come together in November to deal with this critical issue of climate. This year, though, the panel's report takes place as extreme weather events have shaken the US and Canada, Europe and Asia. The question of the role played by human-induced climate change is being asked more loudly than ever. May God help us as we seek to restore that which has been so wonderfully created and given to us all.
- Intense fighting is being reported in Ethiopia's Amhara region the latest sign that the war in Tigray is spreading to neighbouring regions. Officials in Amhara said federal soldiers, as well as Amhara regional troops, had been involved in the fighting against rebels of the Tigray People's Liberation Front (TPLF). With this continual conflict raging, the government has reiterated that the unilateral ceasefire declared last month has not been suspended. Both sides have accused each other of escalating the conflict; as in all conflicts, it is the innocent and the most vulnerable who suffer the greatest. May God soften the hearts of those adding fuel to this fighting and hatred that all may live in peace.
- In Lebanon, medicine, electricity and fuel are scarce. The country is in the grips of one of the world's worst economic crises in more than a century, its currency has

collapsed and it is estimated that more than half its people can no longer afford enough food. Many families are forced to leave their homes behind and enter into refugee camps to survive this crisis. We pray for the people of Lebanon and those in governance over them that they will listen to the cries of the people and seek the help that is badly needed for all to have enough.

- We thank God for the news that South and North Korea have restored their once-severed hotline and the two countries' leaders have agreed to rebuild trust and improve ties. Both leaders have exchanged multiple letters since April in the hopes to re-establish and reopen the communication channels. High hopes are being pinned on US President Joe Biden to restart negotiations aimed at dismantling North Korea's nuclear and missile programmes. May all that happens in this renewed relationship bring harmony and understanding to the two nations.
- Hong Kong's first security law trial ends with a guilty verdict. Former restaurant worker Tong Ying-kit on Tuesday became the first person to be found guilty of offences under Hong Kong's national security law, as the High Court convicted him of terrorism and inciting secession. Tong has not yet been sentenced the maximum sentence that could be handed down being that of life imprisonment. We pray for leniency for this young man from the judiciary system.
- In an attempt to encourage those over 70 or above to take the coronavirus vaccine the government will introduce a new system making the process much easier for those in that age range. Tickets will be issued daily from 24 community vaccination centres. We pray the simplicity of this new scheme will encourage our senior citizens to receive the inoculation.
- Congratulations team Hong Kong! The Tokyo Olympics have brought some pride back to the territories as our Olympic team has done so very well in the competition. The results have shown the high standard of our athletes and the possibilities of what can be achieved if they have the support of the territory behind them. Let us pray the government will see the potential and create a system that will offer proper training and support to our Athletes.
