For the World and Hong Kong

- Myanmar's military coup has ended a brief period of democracy and left many in the dark as communications are shut off. We remember the Burmese people in these turbulent times, regardless of where they stand on the political spectrum. May God comfort the weary and soften hearts of the military leaders who are now in charge.
- Russia has jailed Alexei Navalny, a high-profile critic of Vladmir Putin, triggering a series of protests. With what is shaping up to be a volatile situation, we return to God for His will to be done, and pray that He protects those fighting for justice.
- We pray for the countries in Latin America as they battle a second wave of the coronavirus while trying to implement a large-scale vaccination campaign. Where there are shortages in equipment or medical supply, we pray for God's provision to help healthcare leaders get the pandemic under control and for fairness so that the scarce resources can go to those who need them the most.
- The repercussions of Covid-19 and social restrictions continue to weigh on everyday lives. In Hong Kong, residents in an increasing number of neighbors have faced sudden, ambush style lockdowns, while parents, students and schools are grappling with new guidelines about restarting in-person teaching. We pray for God's peace amid all the uncertainty and guidance at a time we cannot plan.

- We lift up in prayer today the churches and people of all faiths in Andorra, Italy, Malta, Portugal, San Marino, Spain, Vatican City.
- We give thanks for the rich historical legacies and distinctive cultures in these countries; the faithful witness of the churches in the midst of empire building and colonization; the many and diverse waves of

- migrants who have come to these lands; the hospitality that long has been shown to those arriving on their shores.
- We pray for the preservation of the fragile environments and shorelines in this region; an end to economic and political turmoil; stable governments that end corruption and serve the common good; policies that relieve disparities between those who are rich and poor.

For the Congregation

- Pray for sisters and brothers who are facing health challenges recently. May God heal and keep their body and faith strong when they are feeling weak. We keep praying for Jenny's rehabilitation and wellbeing.
- We uphold our senior members in our hearts. May God's peace be with them. Remember and pray for our children in their learning and in their preparation for gradually going back to school after Chinese New Year.
- Pray for our pastors and church leaders in their service to God through KUC. May the Holy Spirit unite them as one in Christ to serve with love and wisdom. In the New Year, we pray for spiritual growth for all members and the whole congregation. May the community of KUC continue to witness for Christ to bring light, hope, and love to the world of darkness. We pray for a stronger and unified community in KUC. We pray that more members and friends are willing to participate in the various ministries of the church and that together we serve God with joy.
