Please remember as you pray...

- We pray for the people of Turkey and Syria who have been devastated by the recent Earthquakes and aftershocks in the surrounding areas. Multiple nations have responded to the desperate need for search and rescue teams, including a team from Hong Kong. May God bless and sustain all attempts to rescue those who are lost, all treatment for those who are injured and comfort the grieving who have lost family members.
- The Chilean government has put three central regions of the country on high alert for forest fires amid a heatwave. Thousands of firefighters continue to battle blazes in the south, consuming almost 300,0000 hectares of land. We pray for the safety of those involved in trying to contain this blaze and those who have given their lives in this work.
- Three months after the declaration of peace in Tigray, Northern Ethiopia, the United Nations has reported helping 50,000 people return to their homeland and families. They also say an increased level of access to humanitarian aid though the needs in the area are far more significant. We thank God for the beginnings of the success of the peace declaration and pray that, in time, all will continue to be well.
- Hundreds of women are protesting in the north-eastern Indian state of Assam after their male relatives were arrested as part of a crackdown on child marriage. The protestors claim that these arrests are disproportionately targeted at Muslims. Indian law maintains the age of marriage to be 18; unfortunately, data shows that more than two out of ten girls are married before 18. We pray for the young girls in these situations for their protection and for the law enforced and kept by all.
- In a true win for conservation and the environment, Australia has blocked the creation of a coal mine under environmental laws for the first time in history. The government rejected the proposed mine due to its proximity to the Great Barrier Reef. May this action be the first of many worldwide as we try to undo some of the damage we have inflicted on creation.
- The Court of Final Appeal on Monday ruled that the authorities breached the rights of two transgender men by refusing to record their new gender on their identity cards because they had not undergone complete sex reassignment

surgery. With this ruling, we pray those who are transgender will find this empowering and affirming.

- We thank God that the government's funding bid for building the light public flats has cleared its first hearing in the legislature this past week. The light housing units will make a big difference in the lives of those who are eligible. We pray for the further development of the building of the units with the best interest of the people at heart.
- We continue our prayers of thanks as we see the number of new Covid cases drop. May the Lord continually strengthen those sick and those who care for them.
