Please remember as you pray...

- As the war in Ukraine enters into its second month an emergency meeting has been called by NATO in Brussels. The United States of America will be represented in this meeting by President Biden. One of the main issues to approve would be the increase of Nato Forces to be sent into the area, to Slovakia, Hungary, Bulgaria, and Romania.
- Though not in the headlines many other countries are facing their wars. In Myanmar, many families daily flee into the forest to seek places of safety as military crackdown on the anti-coup movement continues. For many, the only way to take the whole family including the elderly and those with limited ability is to carry on their backs. Let us not forget those places and people who are not in the headlines.
- Pray for the female students in Afghanistan who were turned back from entering schools this week as the Taliban backtracked on its announcement that schools would open for female students. They stated all-female schools will remain closed until a plan was drawn up in accordance with Islamic Law for them to reopen.
- Earlier in the week a plane dropped from the sky and plunged into a mountain slope, in China. The wreckage of the accident has been recovered with no signs so far that anyone onboard has survived. The plane was carrying 132 people. We pray for those who have lost their lives in this accident, for those desperately waiting for news of loved ones, and for those who are working on the recovery and investigation.
- Hong Kong Chief Executive Carrie Lam has finally acknowledged that
  olerance for the city's pandemic strategy was "fading" among the general
  public and businesses. She announced many changes that will hopefully allow
  the people of Hong Kong to get back to some kind of 'normal'. More
  importantly to open up transport channels with other countries.
- The government has launched a new unemployment subsidy scheme to help those in Hong Kong who have lost their jobs due to the pandemic. Over 100,000 people have made an application on the first day and many more will follow.
- As the education department set to prepare for all case scenarios for those students taking their Diploma of Secondary Education (DSE) Let us pray for all students studying at the moment for the exam next month.
