CONCERNS OF THE CHURCH

For the World and Hong Kong

- Yesterday was May Day, also called International Workers' Day. On this day, many countries around the world commemorate the historic struggles and gains made by workers and the labour movement. Let us remember these struggles and that there are still workers being exploited in many parts of the world. We pray to God that this movement may continue to protect the rights of workers to ensure their fair share of the economy.
- We pray for the people of India as the country has seen a dramatic rise of COVID-19 cases after mass gatherings of the Pilgrims to Kumbh Mela. Hospitals have been overwhelmed and patients have to be turned away because of lack of space and facilities to help them. We pray that the Indian government can take decisive actions to bring the pandemic under control and that the international community help to provide much needed supplies.
- At the Oscars last week, the much-acclaimed film Nomadland won Best Picture and Best Director for Chloé Zhao. This film follows the lives of people who are forgotten and downtrodden by the economy but display dignity and community spirit. It reminds us of the hope and restlessness left even in the wake of great tragedies. We give thanks to God for such hope even in the most desperate times.
- A study released on Thursday by Chinese University's Hong Kong Institute of Asia-Pacific Studies found that young people are becoming more pessimistic about the city's future, and that nearly 60 per cent of Hong Kong youth said they would emigrate if possible. We pray that stakeholders are alarmed by the pessimism and would take concrete steps to look into how young voices and concerns can be heard.

• The statistics from the government in 2019 revealed that youth unemployment was much serious than the general unemployment in Hong Kong. For those who are working, they may not able to earn a decent income and they still suffer from poverty. Working poor is thus a concern in the city and in other parts of the world.

For the Ecumenical Prayer Cycle

- We lift up in prayer today the churches and people of all faiths in Afghanistan, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Mongolia, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, Uzbekistan.
- We are thankful for the magnificent landscapes in these Central Asian countries; the rich natural resources & the incredible ethnic diversity; cultural traditions and practices that have been preserved amid the challenges of modernization; Christians who have courage to witness to the gospel and find the strength to live according to God's word.
- We pray for the people in these lands who suffer from poverty and repressive rule; an end to clashes related to tribalism, traditionalism, and modernization; the land, air and water that have been damaged by human abuse; good relations between Muslims and Christians.
