CONCERNS OF THE CHURCH

- The weather and the destruction it brings dominates so many parts of the world severe drought in all four corners of the globe running parallel with flooding and hurricanes. Hurricane Ida touched ground leaving devastation and destruction in parts of Louisiana and Mississippi. It is thought that in some of the coastal areas hit up to 90% of homes had suffered serious damage. It is estimated that the structural damage caused by Hurricane Ida is far greater than that of Katrina. We thank God that the loss of lives remains in small numbers praying the Lord will strengthen and encourage those trying to retrieve and rebuild what is left of their home and livelihood. For those lands where there is a shortage of water may God send rain and bring life to the parched earth.
- Authorities in Cyprus are monitoring an oil slick that originated from a power plant on Syria's Mediterranean coast and could soon affect the island. The slick has spread to the north along the Syrian coast and is now moving westward closer to the Island, it is estimated it will reach the Karpas Peninsula on Tuesday. The areas affected by the slick is found in the Northern Turkish controlled part of the Island. All preventative measures are being put in place in this time of need and both sides are willing to work as one. We pray for the outcome of this situation for the environment and the people of Cyprus and pray that not only in times of disaster both groups can work together harmoniously.
- All schools in Nigeria's Zamfara state have been closed following the latest mass abduction of students. It is thought that 76 female students and a teacher were taken at gunpoint with fears the numbers may be greater. Even though the Government has deployed thousands of troops to combat this horrific action yet abductions from school is a common occurrence. May God protect all these young people taken and forced into situations against their will and may the families of those who have been taken be comforted as they wait to be reunited with their loved ones.
- As the last soldier left Kabul and the last official airlift of those fleeing to another land took place on the last day of August, the shadow of life under the Taliban becomes a reality once more. British Foreign Secretary Dominic Raab has flown to Doha for talks with Qatari leaders as to how those remaining can be taken from the land in safety. Qatar and her leaders are instrumental in setting up talks with the Taliban and other world leaders. May God guide all who will participate in these talks and keep safe all who wait on the outcome of all conversations.

- It is becoming a regular occurrence that Muslims in India are being targeted by Hindu mobs in unprovoked attacks. These attacks are witnessed, many are uploaded to social media alerting the world of the growing tensions and issues facing the Muslim people in India, with little to no condemnation from the Government. We pray for justice for all people irrespective of religion, gender, colour, ethnicity or orientation.
- On Monday Beijing banned all written exams in school for six and seven-year-olds in an attempt to relieve pressure on pupils and parents caught in China's hyper-competitive school system. This is part of the education reforms being introduced in the country. It is to be hoped that other countries may follow suit and implement similar practices, allowing the children to grow as a child should.
- Local Authorities have extended the registration deadline for the electronic shopping vouchers by two more weeks. Many elderly people in Hong Kong were not successful in making their application, some were not able to work within the confines of modern technology. Now a system has been established to help members of the older generation submit the necessary information. Let us hope that those in Authority realise the needs of all members of society and can find ways to accommodate each one so no one is left behind.
- Pray for our children as they venture back to school. We pray their education will not be disrupted as it has been in the past year.

- We pray for more democratic governments that are free of corruption and that prioritize what the people most need; those working to alleviate the poverty, illiteracy and hunger that so many in these countries still experience; churches faithfully bringing the gospel to and serving, all people with greater respect for how those of other faiths express their spirituality; emotional and physical healing, and restoring hope in people who are victims of conflict, disease and human rights abuses.
