CONCERNS OF THE CHURCH

God does nothing except in response to believing prayer. – John Wesley **Please remember as you pray...**

- As Covid numbers drop in Hong Kong stabilise, there has been a marked increase in recent days. People are suspected of reporting past cases to obtain an exemption from the Government's vaccine pass scheme. May people realise that such actions only complicate the situation.
- Torrential rain has again caused havoc and claimed many lives in Brazil. At least 100 people have lost their lives in this recent downpour; many were residents in poor neighbourhoods and shantytowns. May God's peace strengthen those left behind as they strive to rebuild their lives.
- In an attempt to attract the top graduates from the world's leading universities, the United Kingdom is offering working visas. The scheme has received praise and much criticism, the most significant criticism being it excludes universities from the Global South.
- The lack of medicine and medical supplies and a lack of fuel has forced the largest referral hospital in Ethiopia's Tigray region to suspend its services to the people. After 18 months of war, hospital staff can no longer sustain this essential service. Let us not forget the people of Tigray and the need for peace in that land.
- Lawmakers in the Central African Republic have joined 23 other African countries as they have decided to abolish capital punishment in the CAR. There have been no executions in CAR since 1981. In addition, approximately 170 countries have already abolished the death penalty from their laws.

- Russia edges closer to overtaking the city of Severodonetsk. If the Russian troops were victorious and captured its smaller twin city Lysychansk, Russian forces would control all of Luhansk. Unfortunately, many civilians remain in the city and now are in great danger. May God protect all.
- In Myanmar, the United Nations has cited that the number of displaced people in the country has exceeded more than a million. As the monsoon season approaches and the fighting continues, the UN warns of the dire conditions ahead.
- In North Korea, more than a million people have now been sickened by what Pyongyang is calling a 'fever'. There have been fatalities, but it is unclear how many and if the deaths were due to Covid. North Korea has a limited testing capacity, so few cases are confirmed. So let us pray that the needs of the people will shake the leadership to take affirmative action.
- Chief Executive Carrie Lam has said on Tuesday that the Government will not further relax social distancing measures at this time. Let us all strive to do our best to be mindful of our neighbours and ourselves.
