Please remember as you pray...

- We continue to pray for all in the world living under the threat of COVID. As the number of daily new cases topped 4,500 here in Hong Kong, the health authority is looking into expanding the use of oral antivirals. We seek God's hand of healing and sustenance on those who have contracted the virus and God's comfort on those who have lost loved ones.
- Pope Francis has formally apologised to Canada's native people for the Church's role in schools where indigenous children were abused, branding forced cultural assimilation "evil" and a "disastrous error". He also called for a "serious investigation" of the so-called residential schools and more assistance to help the survivors and descendants heal. His words have comforted those who have heard them. May they now be put into action.
- More than 200 people were killed in gang violence in Haiti's capital, Port- au-Prince, in the space of 10 days. Almost half of those who died were residents caught in the crossfire without ties to the gangs. Locals have reported running out of basic supplies as all deliveries have ceased amid the shoot-outs. We remember those trying to maintain the peace and seek God's protection on those seeking to mediate between the rival gangs.
- Flash flooding has claimed the lives of at least 21 people and left at least 55 needing rescue in Iran's southern Fars province. After several droughts over the last decade, any rainwater that falls cannot permeate the sun-baked earth. Climate change and overuse have brought about this human-made phenomenon. When will we learn!
- The Nigerian Army has found two more Chibok girls over eight years since their abduction. Both girls are mothers now and are soon to reunite with family and friends. What a time of joy that will be. God bless this reunion and restart of life.
- Myanmar's military has executed four democracy activists in what is believed to be the first use of capital punishment in decades. Protestors took to the streets as news of the executions spread throughout the country. World leaders have condemned the actions of the Junta, offering their support to the people of Myanmar and their struggle for democracy. Let us do the same!

- A shallow but powerful earthquake hit the province of Abra in the Northern Philippines on Wednesday. We thank God that the fatalities are low, but the damage to property and infrastructure is great. May God provide and protect the people through yet another natural disaster.
- Ukraine says work has started at three shipping ports to form "green corridors" to allow grain exports to leave the country. The Ukrainian navy will lead the ships through the minefields in the Black Sea. We pray this will be achieved as the world, particularly the developing world, is feeling the effects of war on their economy and food banks.
- AIDS researchers announced this week that a fourth person has been 'cured' of HIV, but the dangerous procedure for those also battling cancer may be little comfort for the tens of millions living with the virus worldwide. Let us hope that the research will continue and be possible for all living with HIV.
- During these days of sweltering weather here in Hong Kong, let us remember those in our prayers who cannot find any relief from the heat, those who work outdoors, and those who are homeless.
- As schools break up for summer, we pray for God's protection on all children and their families who may struggle to make provision for the children being home.
