For the World and Hong Kong

- Major protests have broken out in Belarus in response to the disputed 14
 August election. Hundreds of thousands have rallied across the country,
 calling for the resignation of long-time President Alexander Lukashenko.
 Thousands have been arrested, hundreds injured, and at least four people
 have died. Pray for fair elections, clean government and protection of
 protesters.
- In Thailand, a wide coalition of activists, students, and artists have been protesting the current military-backed government since February. Among their demands are democratic reforms and limitations on the power of the monarchy. May the people's voices be heard and heeded.
- The killing of Zara Alvarez, the human right activist in the Philippines, reminded us of the serious human rights abuse and the problem of extrajudicial killing in the country. Pray for justice for Alvarez and all victims of extrajudicial killings. May God comfort and mercy reign for those who are in grief.
- In the US, many communities in the state of Iowa are still recovering from a powerful storm, called a "derecho." Hurricane-force winds destroyed homes and buildings and devastated the state's corn crop, leaving lasting economic damage. May emergency relief and aid be given quickly for the people to restore electricity, housing and livelihood. We also remember the US Presidential election in November. May the citizens elect the right leader who can bring unity, justice and peace to the nation and the world.
- 22.5 million people throughout the world have contracted the coronavirus, the number of fatalities 790,000 people with 14.4 million recovered as of 21 August. In Hong Kong, the total number of confirmed cases is 4,605 with 75 deaths from the virus and 3,827 recovered. Keep praying for healing and the vaccines to be ready for use soon. Remember the vulnerable, the poor, the medical staff and cleaners who are working in the forefront. May God's mercy and provision be with those who suffer from the economic downturn due to Covid-19.
- Many cases related to the protests have been trialed in the courts. May
 justice reign for the righteous. With the postponement of the LegCo

election, we pray for unity, calmness and resilience of the democratic political leaders. May God give them wisdom and humility to serve the city and bring the best to the people in this time of trial.

• We lift up in prayer today the churches and people of all faiths of Cape Verde, The Gambia, Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, Senegal. We give thanks for the many ways in which these countries have moved beyond their colonial histories such as scars related to slave trade; economic and educational advances that have lifted some out of poverty. We pray for eradication of poverty, promising transitions into democracy and changes in government leaders; the persistent, faithful witness of churches in the midst of other faiths.
