CONCERNS OF THE CHURCH

For the World and Hong Kong

- We pray for the United States of America, whose deep division is laid bare in the results of the Presidential and national elections. Standing with those who honour democratic principles, we pray for justice, truth and integrity for those who lead and serve the country. May there be a peaceful transition of power and the government is able to protect their people as the country battles a new surge of Covid-19 cases exceeding 100,000 a day.
- We remember the 73 Palestinians who have lost their homes in West Bank after Israel demolished their dwellings without notice. May God provide them with shelter, both physically and spiritually, as they live through long-running conflicts.
- Tension in Ethiopia is high after Prime Minister Abiy Ahmed vowed to continue a military offensive in the northern state of Tigray, while the Tigrayan president warned his region is in a state of war. We pray for peace, trusting God will find a way in the toughest circumstances.
- We mourn the killing of four people in Vienna, where a suspected terrorist has injured 23 others in a gun attack. We are at a loss as to why these attacks keep happening. But we lift Austria up to you and pray that your radical love will counter radical violence.
- Amid mounting concerns about freedom of the press in Hong Kong, we remember Bao Choy, the investigative journalist who was arrested for reporting on the 21 July incident with RTHK, as well as others striving to document and uncover what's happening in our city. We pray to God to bless all seekers of truth and grant us wisdom to discern what is true and what is false.

• We lift up in prayer today the churches and people of all faiths of Aotearoa New Zealand and Australia.

- We are thankful for the how the people have welcomed new immigrants; and how churches have witnessed and worked together ecumenically, especially amid challenges of apathy in highly secularized societies.
