* COMMISSION and BLESSING

- Another shooting has occurred in the USA, targeting those from the LGBT community in Colorado Springs. We seek God's peace for those who have lost their lives and their family and friends who grieve for them.
- The World Health Organisation and the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention have warned that measles is at "Imminent threat " of spreading in various parts of the world after the COVID 19 pandemic led to many children missing their routine vaccinations. So let us hope and pray that there can be a vaccine drive to help unvaccinated children.
- Several places have been badly affected by earthquakes and the aftershocks that have ensued. Rescuers in West Java are battling dozens of aftershocks in their search for survivors from the recent earthquake, which has claimed almost 300 lives, including that of many children. Around 151 people remain missing, and more than 100 are injured. A large earthquake was reported near the Solomon Islands; a tsunami warning was issued on Tuesday. By the grace of God, there were no fatalities. May the Lord bring healing to the injured, peace to those who mourn, and energy and strength to those seeking to find the lost.
- As temperatures drop in Ukraine, the World Health Organization alerts the world community to the plight of those caught in the war-torn area. Ten million people live without power in their homes as half of Ukraine's energy structure has been damaged or destroyed. Temperatures are expected to plummet to 20C. In addition, there have been multiple attacks on the health infrastructure since the conflict began. May God have mercy on all trying to survive in those lands, and may a peaceful solution be found.
- The registered number of street sleepers on the streets of Hong Kong has risen from 595 people in 2013 to 1564 people this year. This is an increase of 2.6 times in the last decade. However, despite the government's allocation of 30 million dollars in grants to local NGO's serving this community, only 27% of those eligible are receiving the help they need. The Audit Commission has urged the Social Welfare Department to review and monitor the system. Pray that all can create a strategy to help all those in need.

• We pray for all in the world suffering under the shadow of Covid 19. As case figures remain high in our city, we hold in prayer those on the front line dealing with the virus. We also remember those who have lost loved ones.
