# Please remember as you pray...

- The United States and Mexico have agreed to a plan that will allow some Venezuelan immigrants to enter the United States. However, the plan clearly states that people entering without permission will be sent back to Mexico immediately. Some six million people have already fled Venezuela leaving behind the violence, fuel and medical shortages and repression by the government of President Maduro. We thank God for this plan to help a small portion of immigrants, always remembering those left behind and the trials they face.
- Russian air strikes have left energy facilities across Ukraine badly damaged. As a result, the power supply is limited and extremely low. The government has appealed to the people to limit use during peak hours of the day. We hope that people can limit their use of power to enable all emergency services to continue for those in need and that they can make adequate repairs.
- Extreme weather conditions further dominate and draw concern worldwide. The people of Nigeria, still trying to deal with the recent floods, are warned that there will be more flooding. Over a million people are displaced, and at least 500 lives are lost. May God protect those who are already very vulnerable to face all that comes their way, and may God strengthen those involved in the recovery work.
- As protests continue in Iran, stories of mistreatment and violence are being shared daily through social media. In an attempt to control the protestors, the government forces use heavy, violent tactics against the people, life is lost, and people are 'disappearing'. May God protect all on the streets of Iran, standing for a just system for all.
- The people of Northern Thailand gathered to bid farewell to those whose lives were taken in a horrendous act of violence last week. 22 of the 36 lives were those of preschool children. We pray for those who have lost their loved ones that they may find peace and comfort amidst the memories of such violence. We pray for all victims of violence.

- After the suspension of 14 pupils for three days from school for failure to attend the raising of the national flag, HK educational professionals have called for officials to review and revise the guidelines given to schools for this type of event. They are calling for a need for clarity in the guidelines for both Educators and students. The actions incurred by this local school are very concerning. We pray that this will not incite fear among our young students in school and also among parents for their children.
- For the first time, the National Security Law was used in a trial for those under 18. A three years sentence in detention was handed down to five teenagers in Hong Kong for advocating the overthrow of the Beijing government. The teenagers participated in the 2019 protests. We pray for these young people and their future.

May God bless the service more and more and strengthen those who have dedicated their lives to the work of support and advocacy.
