Please remember as you pray...

- Thank God for the dropping number of local Covid -19 cases in Hong Kong and pray for God's hand of healing to be on those battling this virus.
- Ukraine Russia conflict continues. Russian Forces pound the city of Mariupol. In the last part of the city held by Ukrainian forces, it is thought at least 200 civilians are trapped.
- Claims and concerns are being raised for the safety of thousands of Ukrainian Special Needs children. Unfortunately, these children are abandoned and forgotten about in institutions which can no longer look after them. General care and provisions for the children are not there. May God have mercy on every one of them.
- The United Nations Secretary-General Antonio Guterres has appealed to international donors not to divert resources from other humanitarian activities worldwide to Ukraine. Instead, he asks that donors consider donating additionally to Ukraine without undermining efforts elsewhere worldwide.
- Almost six months after a massive earthquake hit the people of Bagua, Peru, hundreds of people are still homeless and living in tents. President Castillo promised to provide for the community's needs and have them rehoused, but nothing has been done! Many who supported him and voted him into office no longer feel that they can trust him.
- In an attempt to quell the violent outburst between the Hindu and Muslim communities in an area of Jodhpur, the capital of Northern India's Rajasthan state, Government officials have imposed curfews and cut off internet connections to all people. May God opens the eyes and the hearts of the people for a greater understanding of each other.
- We pray for the people of the Philippines as they go to the ballot boxes tomorrow.
- Hong Kong's record of press freedom has plummeted almost 70 places and is now 148th according to 'The Reporters Without Borders' annual index on press freedom. The sharp descent is a direct result of the introduction of the National Security Law imposed in 2020.
- That the Hong Kong Government will heed the appeals of grassroots mothers in Hong Kong to provide childcare services that would enable them to work and provide for the needs of their children. During this pandemic, many young mothers have given up work to take care of their children at home.
- We give special thanks today to all who mother us.
- Pray for the continued support of NGOs in Hong Kong who are working tirelessly to obtain food supplies and other necessities for those in most profound need. Our Peacemaking Team is among those working to bring some joy to those in need.
