

CONCERNS OF THE CHURCH

- Since the beginning of the pandemic there has been an increase in the production and smuggling of fake drugs around the world. Authorities are cracking down on this type of crime with operations being led by World Customs. People are being cheated by counterfeit medicine, many lives have been lost or seriously impaired. May God protect those tempted to try the medicine on offer and may those behind all this be brought to justice.
- We pray for the people of Korea both North and South, equally the two countries • took it in turn to test ballistic missiles. With this action North Korea has breached the resolutions set by the United Nations and maintains the stalemate in place in the negotiations concerning nuclear arms talks. May eyes, ears, mouths and hearts be opened to strive for peace and harmony through words and understanding not fear and war.
- In a landmark decision, an Indonesian court has ruled that President Joko Widodo • and other top officials have been negligent in tackling air pollution in Jakarta. The court has ordered monitoring stations and other measures to improve the capital's air. This could be a ray of hope for those campaigning similar situations throughout the world – may all those in governance take heed of this decision taken in Indonesia and use all they have to improve the living environment of those they serve.
- The Hospital Authority plans to extend the retirement age for all staff to 65. It has been noted that there is a shortage in personnel within public hospitals and this move would be primarily in place to retain staff within the organisation. Many of the HA staff have emigrated from the territory. If this motion is passed, we pray for those who will be pressured into working for more years in a highly stressful environment, within this may provision be made for a shorter week and shorter working hours.
- Yet another NGO has announced it will disband, 'Wall fare', a prisoners' rights ۲ group offering humanitarian aid and support to those incarcerated in correctional facilities as well as their families. This group has provided a vital service and offered hope and encouragement to a very vulnerable and often misunderstood group of people. May God call people and make a way to continue with this support in one way or another.

- We lift up in prayer today the churches and people of all faiths in Argentina, Paraguay, Uruguay.
- We are thankful for individuals, churches and other organizations who remain committed to seeking healing, justice and truth; the furthering of human rights and democratic institutions; the ways in which those of different faiths and ethnicities are working together for the common good and for the needs of people and creation; how churches, from out of what people are experiencing, have led global ecumenical work for an economy that serves life.

He retired from DBS in 2017 and shortly afterwards was invited to become chaplain at All Saints' Cathedral and Middle School where he continues to serve. Bill hails from Paisley, near Glasgow and enjoys the lifestyle here. Music has played an important part in his life. In his younger years he sang as a lay clerk in Paisley Abbey and St Mary's Cathedral (Edinburgh) choirs. As a producer of amateur music clubs for a number of years, he directed many performances across Scotland, mainly in Glasgow and the surrounding area. Since 2015 he has been freelancing as a broadcaster with RTHK and continues to host a weekly music programme on Radio 4. He has passed his love of music to his sons, one of whom is a professional singer after gaining his degree in music. The other completed a course in musical theatre before taking up journalism at Napier University in Edinburgh from which he has just graduated. This year marks his fiftieth year in teaching and he intends to retire back to Scotland in 2023.
