CONCERNS OF THE CHURCH

- Covid 19 continues to rear its ugly head controlling the lifting and enforcement of lockdown throughout the world. For all in the world dealing with this virus, we pray God's hand of protection and healing for those who have tirelessly served others. We pray for God's added strength as areas throughout the world open up. May people not forget those who have lost their lives or suffer long-term health challenges due to the virus.
- Ariel Henry has been sworn in as Haiti's new prime minister, nearly two weeks after the assassination of the country's President Jovenel Moïse. We pray that in his new post he will take time to listen to the cries of the people he has been called to lead and instil some calm to a land and people in turmoil.
- The British Home Secretary has established a multi-million pound deal with the French Government in an attempt to stem the rising number of migrants crossing the English Channel. The deal agreed will see France double the number of police patrolling its beaches. It will also fund improved intelligence sharing and introduce better technology to target the gangs who organise the crossings for a profit. It is indeed a way forward to stop the trafficking of human lives for profit but we can also see that this action puts more pressure on those trying to find a place of safety. Yet another path is narrowed. May God's hand of protection be on all.
- The deployment of troops in South Africa has subdued the civil unrest seen in the last few weeks. The number who have lost their lives during this time has reached an estimated 260 people, businesses are desperately trying to recoup from the endless looting and those with next to no food or provisions seek to survive. May the Lord bring peace to those who have lost loved ones and may the necessary provisions be found particularly for the most vulnerable.
- The Islamic State (IS) has claimed responsibility for a recent bomb attack that has claimed the lives of at least 30 people and wounded dozens more in the Iraqi capital, Baghdad. This has been the most severe bombing in the last six months. The bombing was planned on the busiest of days for families preparing for the feast of Eid al-Adha. Let us pray for peace in these lands where life, it seems, is no longer sacred, praying for all involved, that there may be a greater understanding of the other.
- Tokyo saw the opening of the '2020 Olympics' a year after the proposed date. Much of the games will continue behind closed doors as the country struggles with surging numbers of Covid-19 cases. Many countries and individual athletes have withdrawn from the games and these games are not without internal scandal and changes.
 - Yet we all can join in and agree with the words of WHO chief Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus in his keynote address for the International Olympic Committee, "May these

Games be the moment that unites the world, and ignites the solidarity and determination we need to end the pandemic together."

- Adverse weather conditions throughout the world continue to threaten and endanger many parts of the world in the USA and Canada as wildfires continue to rage. The people of Germany set to recover from the devastating floods of last week, and closer to home the heavy rain of the last week has caused havoc and claimed many lives. May God comfort all who have been bereaved, strengthen those who continue the rescue and recovery mission. May God help us to understand more of this wonderful creation and let us take responsibility for all that we have or have not done to maintain that which we have been given.
- As our eyes and hearts follow the many court cases here in Hong Kong arising from the aftermath of 2019 and the installation of the NSL we pray that Justice will prevail and the truth be made known.
- Many congratulations to our Brothers and Sisters of the United Church of Christ in the Philipines, Hong Kong, as they celebrate the 6th anniversary of the formation of the church here in Hong Kong. May God continue to bless this ministry.

- We lift up in prayer today the churches and people of all faiths in **Burundi**, the **Democratic Republic of Congo** and **Rwanda**.
- We are thankful for the abundant natural resources in the DRC and the mountainous beauty of Rwanda; those who have worked for healing and reconciliation in Rwanda, especially after the genocide; the tireless efforts of churches and community organizations, working with the support of humanitarian organizations, to improve the living conditions of the people.
- We pray for an end to poverty and hunger, and improved access to health services, especially for the young, that they might have hope for their future; an end to rebel movements across borders and the political instability this stirs up; just economic development that does not exploit Creation and people; democratic election of clean governments that work for the sake of all.


