- Remember those throughout the world who have 'disappeared' from their communities and society. Remember also the families who are left behind not knowing where their loved ones are.
- As we pray for peace in the world we pray that all fighting and raising of arms will cease. In the light of the rumours being raised in the Russian / Ukraine situation, we pray that dialogue will be the way towards finding a solution.
- We give thanks to God that humanitarian aid is finally now addressing the needs of the people of Tonga after the recent volcanic eruption and subsequent tsunami, which has claimed lives, devoured homes and livelihoods.
- The cleanup process of a massive oil spill off the Peruvian coast. It is thought an oil tanker was hit by waves believed to originated from Tonga's volcanic eruption. As the people strive to recover the wildlife affected and clean up the beaches those in power argue on who is responsible to compensate for the damage.
- That justice and truth have been seen in action as a German court has sentenced a Syrian colonel, Anwar Raslan, to life in prison for crimes against humanity. This trial the first of what may be many is the first criminal case brought over state-led torture in Syria.
- We continue to pray for interreligious tolerance and understanding throughout
 the world. In particular we pray for the conflicts between Hindus and Muslims
 in the northern Indian state of Uttar Pradesh. We pray that there will be no
 repercussions after the arrest of the outspoken militant Priest Yati
 Narsinghanand Saraswati.
- As people on the mainland start to make plans for travelling home during Lunar New Year, some may already be on the move. We pray all will take precautions for health and safety not only for themselves but also for those around them.
- The Hong Kong Government has announced that all children between the ages of 5 – 11 can now be vaccinated. We pray for all parents making these decisions for their children.
- Secondary schools will close their doors until after the Lunar New Year holidays. Pray for our children and young people as their education is disrupted once again, for the teachers and the parents.
