Please remember as you pray...

- For the protection of all journalists throughout the world facing the many challenges to maintain newsfeeds and to bring the stories of the voiceless to the attention of the world. We in particular remember those of this profession in Mexico where three journalists have been murdered this year alone.
- For the lives of those unaccounted for in a boat capsize off the coast of Florida. One person was rescued from the scene and dozens are still missing. It is believed this was an attempt to smuggle people into the USA illegally and it has been reported that there was no safety measure in place.
- We give thanks for the recent law passed in France, criminalising the use of so-called "conversion therapy" to attempt to change the sexual orientation or gender identity of LGBTQ people. In the words of President Macron, "being oneself is not a crime." We pray for the healing of body and mind for those who have been subjected to such treatment.
- Countries and policies in Europe concerning the measures to uphold during the continuing pandemic has divided Europe, even as cases continue to increase. Such division can be very dangerous for all, particularly as this variant is so much more virulent.
- It is believed that North Korea has fired two ballistic missiles in the sea. This will be the sixth round of weapons launched this month alone. These come amidst threats from the North of the resumption of nuclear testing.
- With increased numbers of positive cases in Hong Kong, more areas of the territory have been forced into lockdown. We pray for those in lockdown that God may give them patience and understanding during this time.
- We pray for a greater monitoring system to be put in place to safeguard the lives of children who are placed in 'Care facilities' in Hong Kong as further cases of abuse have been recorded in a government-run foster home facility in the Prince Edward area.
