Please remember as you pray...

- While we thank God for the current Covid-19 situation here in Hong Kong as numbers decrease daily, we must remember others dealing with this virus worldwide. We recognise the people of Shanghai and the authorities' actions in that city. May God protect and sustain all in such harsh conditions.
- Russian President Vladimir Putin has warned the rest of the world that if they try to intervene in the current conflict, they will face a "lightning-fast" response. Reports from both sides of the conflict claim vast losses of life, though absolute figures are not yet available. Russia has now proclaimed that it will withhold the sale of gas to neighbouring Poland and Bulgaria, claiming all must be paid in Roubles. The European Commission has accused Russia of blackmail against these countries.
- After not knowing how many people had been kidnapped in Nigeria's Kaduna train attack, photos of 62 people are released to the public, bringing relief and grief to family members. Currently, no ransom demands have been issued. To stamp out kidnapping, which has become an industry, the Nigerian senate has passed a bill imposing prison sentences on those who respond to the kidnappers' demands. However, the bill will still need to go through the lower house before the president signs it.
- The Anti- Semitism Worldwide report 2021 has released figures showing a dramatic rise in anti-Semitic incidents worldwide. The USA, Canada, The United Kingdom, Germany and Australia were named. Hate crimes against religious groups are rising across the globe. Let us pray for greater understanding and peace.

- The record-breaking temperatures hitting the continent of India are one of the leading causes of multiple fire outbreaks in both the rural and city areas. In addition, numbers of refuge collection points in and around the cities are ablaze, adding to the already polluted air.
- We continue to pray for the situation in Myanmar and for the well-being of Aung San Sui Kyi, who was sentenced to five years in jail. She is charged with corruption.
- The National Security Law has brought many changes to the territory, one which is concerning is that which affects conditions of bail. Bail is denied for those arrested under this new law; previously, a person would remain free until trial. Critics of this pre-trial detention say this is designed to break the will of those accused.
- Pray for the continued support of NGOs in Hong Kong who are working tirelessly to obtain food supplies and other necessities for those in deepest need. Our Peacemaking Team is among those working to bring some joy to those in need.
