God does nothing except in response to believing prayer. – John Wesley Please remember as you pray. . .

- Covid-19 figures in Hong Kong continue to drop, and we again thank God for all the mercy shown. We pray for all front line workers that they will be able to recharge and recoup and enjoy some well-earned rest time.
- Researchers from the Hong Kong Polytechnic University have released their latest research programme that shows that one in ten people in the city suffered from an anxiety disorder triggered by the Covid-19 pandemic. Let it be our hope that our Government will acknowledge this research and make provisions for those who find themselves in this position.
- As the conflict in Ukraine continues, we pray for peace. We also pray that the loads of grain being held in loaded ships be released from the port of Mariupol to avoid the grain going to waste.
- We pray for families worldwide who have lost their loved ones to violence. As yet another mass shooting case in the United States, we must question the gun laws of that country and all other countries where people can purchase and carry firearms freely.
- The number of people forced to flee conflict, violence, human rights violations and persecution has crossed the colossal figure of 100 million for the first time on record. The figure was released by the United Nations Refugee Agency earlier in the week. May God protect all who have been forced to leave all that is familiar to them. And encourage all those in governance to find provisions for all.
- In Sylhet, Bangladesh, monsoon rains continue to cause havoc as water continues to build up and flood the homes and fields of the people. Many farmers have failed to save any of their crops due to the floods. Water is receding slowly, but the damage is done already.
- The US pharmaceutical giant Pfizer has said it would sell its patented drugs on a not-for-profit basis to the world's poorest countries as part of a new initiative

announced at the World Economic Forum in Davos. May other companies follow their example and offer this help to those in greatest need.

- Pray for the people of Sri Lanka as the continued financial crisis is affecting the most vulnerable in society.
- A concern group in Hong Kong has disclosed that almost 900 public flats across the city are sitting empty around 400 of them have been vacant for more than a year. These figures are very concerning when many in Hong Kong desperately need affordable housing.
- As we near the commemorative date of June 4, the Catholic Diocese of Hong Kong has announced that it will not hold masses to mark the June 4 anniversary this year. Even though there have not been public gatherings remembering this historic date, let us not forget to pray for those who never said goodbye to their children and long to know where they may be or what truly happened to them.
